

#### In the HORTICULTURE DIVISION:

' Y Four Awards of Merit were received: ELIZABETH PESCI for Salvia 'Black & Blue'; NORMA FOWKES for Hosta 'Patriot'; MARY ANN ARTMAN for cut specimen, Alocasia 'Thai Giant', which also received the Award of Horticultural Excellence; TERRY RODGERS for a medicinal herb, Tanacetum vulgare (Tansy). One Award of Merit was withheld from the Rose Section, due to the lack of the Botanic Name on the worthy specimen. ELIZABETH PESCI earned an Arboreal Award (Tree Branches) for Pinus umbrac 'Dragon's Eye'. MARY ANN ARTMAN earned an Arboreal Award (Shrub Branches) for Hydrangea macrophylla 'Double Delight Perfection'; two Grower's Choice Awards for Euphorbia milli hybrid (Crown of Thorns – Grown primarily for Bloom) and Alocasia 'Thai Giant' (Container/Combination Planting, one variety). In addition, Mary Ann earned the Horticulture Sweepstakes Award.
