The KNH Centre for Biomedical Egyptology is a unique university facility which has developed the use of scientific and biomedical techniques to examine Egyptian mummies and human remains to gain a better understanding of what life was like in Ancient Egypt. The lecture will demonstrate how medical and scientific tools can be utilised to investigate disease, diet, medical and pharmaceutical treatments, and religious beliefs and practices. Professor David will also describe current fieldwork being undertaken by the KNH Centre Missions in Egypt, and will provide information about the new online MSc Degree in Biomedical Egyptology offered by the KNH Centre.
