

#### PAGE 2 A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Mark 13:1-8, 24-37: As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings! Then Jesus asked him, Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down. "When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?" Then Jesus began to say to them, Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, I am he!' and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.

But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

#### Brothers and sisters in Christ.

When I was in grade school we used to have drills where we were taught to "duck and cover", basically what happened was that a specific alarm would go off at a random point during the school day and then we would have to dive under our desks as quickly as possible. I remember this because I would hit my head on the side of that metal desk every single time. I had little to no knowledge as to why we did this at first but then once I was old enough to understand why we did it, it was absolutely terrifying and then when I realized that what we were doing was absolutely things we want to do things are not going to be the same. useless then I was bewildered as to why we did it in the first place. We did this due to the fear of a nuclear attack on America by the USSR and whether we were sitting at our desk or under them it wouldn't matter if a nuclear bomb exploded nearby, the

entire exercise was created to provide children and parents with a false sense of security.

While the pandemic that we are living though right now is nothing like what people went through during the Cold War they do share one thing in common, hysteria, brought on by an overarching dread that just hangs over everything.

During the 1<sup>st</sup> century Christian and Jewish people living in Judea also faced a very uncertain future. Mark was written just after one third of Jerusalem's population was wiped and the temple was destroyed. The vast majority of Americans can't even fathom what it must have been like to be one of the survivors of that attack. Roman soldiers not only put down the revolt that was going on but decided to make sure that no such revolt would ever happen again. The only modern day comparison I can think of would be what happened to Syria over the last few years and how much destruction it has faced.

Whether you are someone living in 1<sup>st</sup> century Judea or you're someone having to drastically alter your daily life due to a global pandemic, it would be easy to get sucked into this idea that everything is coming to an end. So with that in mind lets turn back to the text. Jesus is letting us know that terrible things happen, they have happened, and they are going to happen again. Most of these things we have little or no control over, the only thing that we do have some semblance of control over, is how we react to these things. Should we allow fear and despair to take over? Or do we use these experiences to grow and come together as people?

While it may not seem like it at first, these are words of hope. Yes, the passage is known as Mark's Apocalypse but in reality apocalypse just means "a revealing" thus Jesus is not foretelling our doom, he is just revealing those things that we will face, reminding us that it doesn't mean that the end is near. I have seen countless conspiracy theories being spread on-line about secret origins, how this is all a political ploy, and how everything is either far worse or far better then what people are leading us to believe. Often these claims have very little basis in fact, and are best left ignored like a lot of other stuff on the internet. We need to trust the experts in this field, not those who pretend to be, and look at ways we can do our part not to make things worse. Meanwhile we need to also constantly seek out new and creative ways that we can stay in contact with those around us, continue building community even though we may not be able to be present physically with each other. It is true, after all the businesses are back open, and we are able to travel to the all the places we want to go, and do all the

# CHILI COOK-OFF PRACTICE

Since our Chili Cook-Off was abruptly postponed, take some time to perfect your entry for next time. Or just use this one!

#### WISCONSIN'S CHILI RECIPE

2 lbs ground beef I medium green pepper, diced I medium onion, diced Salt and pepper to taste I clove minced garlic I tsp cumin seed I large can crushed tomatoes I small can tomato sauce 2 cans dark red kidney beans I Tbl sugar Brown beef in skillet with pep-

pers, onion, garlic, salt and pepper. Drain fat, remove beef to large cooking pot.

Add beans, crushed tomatoes, tomato sauce, cumin and sugar. Cover and cook over low

heat for 1 1/2 to 2 hours, stirring frequently. Add water up to 1 cup or more if sauce is too thick. For garnish, Governor Thompson suggests Wisconsin shredded cheddar cheese and sour cream. Serves 8.

#### SOUP SUPPER: **BROCCOLI** CHEESE

- $I \frac{1}{2}$  cup chopped onion
- 1/2 c butter or margarine
- <sup>3</sup>∕₄ c flour 2 (10  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz) cans chicken broth
- I gt milk
- 2 cups sliced carrots, parboiled I cup diced celery, parboiled
- 2 cups broccoli, parboiled
- 1/2 3/4 lb processed American cheese, cubed



Parboil carrots, celery and broccoli in water and one can of chicken broth. I start the vegetables in a small amount of water, then add the chicken broth as needed. Don't drain the vegetables. Set aside.

In to a large non-stick saucepan, saute onion in butter. Add flour to make a paste. Gradually add one can of chicken broth and milk. Cook until the mixture thickens, about 8-10 minutes.

Add the vegetables and liquid to the milk mixture. Add the cubed cheese and heat until the cheese melts. Don't let the soup boil hard at this point as it will separate. Salt to taste.




