## Minutes from the May 4, 2011 Meeting

The GSSN met at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV on Wednesday, May 4, 2011. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM & led in pledging allegiance to the flag. Ian welcomed all to the meeting and asked that cell phones be turned off. (65 signed in and there were eleven visitors.) Next Ian asked who had attended the outing & commented on the Gold Show. Dara gave the Treasurer's Report and Fred Zajac made a motion to accept the report as read. Phillis Harding seconded the motion and by show of hands it was unanimously approved. Several people said they'd found gold and Fred passed around a vial containing some gold he'd found. Our next outing will be May 21 & 22 at the 28 Claim. Pot luck will held Saturday and on Sunday breakfast and lunch will be served. Attendees should bring beverages and chairs.

Under new business, stickers for purposes of identification and publicizing GSSN were discussed. (Types of stickers/ badges will be researched.) Jake will chair an ID Committee and asked that any volunteers wishing to serve contact him. Next Ian provided some info on BLM's rules on camping on public lands. Since we own mineral rights on our claims--not the actual land itself--we are effected by BLM's rules. Rules on camping state that "camping is allowed on public lands...for no more than a period of 14 days within any period of 28 consecutive days." Motorized or mechanical devices are not permitted.

After a brief break Jake spoke to the group about Fred Hissong's medical condition and asked that we bow our heads for our friend. He then mentioned that the Nye Goldseekers are hosting an outing in May at Gold Point to which GSSN is invited. Those interested can contact Janisse. George Niederriter then announced he is putting together a new website "goldsearcher.info" which people can access to get info. Ian thanked Rick of Desert Outfitters for their raffle contributions. A member asked about the "Public Lands for the People Inc" handout & Steve Christenson explained that it is a group based in Calif. that lobbies and directs their efforts at keeping public lands open. Next John Bronstein asked for a volunteer to chair the Claims Committee when he steps down in Oct. He said he'll help with the learning process and would be willing to stay on as an assistant. He briefly described what would be involved with this task.

There being no further new business, the door prize of \$17 was won by John Bronstein; and Rick Young won the 50/50 amounting to \$30. Other raffle prizes awarded were: see front page.

# **Directions to GSSN Section 28 Claim**

Cross the Hoover Dam on US 93.

After passing the 41 mile marker in Arizona, turn left onto APearce Ferry Road@. Drive through the town of ADolan Springs@. Make sure to obey the speed limit signs. The county sheriff is tough on speeding!!!!

Continue to about mile marker 22 and turn left onto AGregg=s Hideout Road@. This is a county improved dirt road. Stay on the county improved road about 7 or 8 miles. The road will make a hard left turn then a hard right turn. After the right turn you will come to a cattle guard. Continue to the next cattle guard.

Turn left after this cattle guard and follow the fence to where this road ends.

Turn right and go to the second left follow this to our claims. (the first left is into a spot the MPA uses for a camping area).

You should see one or two of our claim corner posts marked GSSN near the road.

### Frederick Hissong
