WELCOME 2019 MUSIC NOTES: From Rebecca Harrold

It's a NEW YEAR. The headlines are all about a "NEW ME"....but I'm focusing on the "same



old me" in a good way. You see, I have been a church musician since I was in elementary school. Daily I would hear the teachers at my Catholic school praise me for my musical skills and implore me to "Always sing for God". As an obvious outcome to their encouragement, singing and playing to God has been my life vocation. And to that end, as a church musician, I feel very honored to have a role that speaks straight to the heart of the believers who come together each Sunday (or Saturday) to worship God. More times than not, I am reminded how God speaks to the heart directly and concisely through music. When I choose songs at the church where I direct, I meditate on the people I see each Sunday, I listen to what they've said to me about their own personal struggles and victories and I allow God to move in my heart to find music that will minister not only through scripture (the written word) but also, and MOST importantly, through musical inspiration.

To me, music speaks it's own language more purely than any other form of communication so as I play song choices, I feel in my heart and register what the message is I am getting from the sound and mood of the piece. Even as people listen to the music, it is very beneficial to tune into the body and note where they feel the music resonating in their body. This loosens any knots or blockages that

may have been in their spiritual experiences. And by allowing the music to move through the body, the blocks can be removed and the knots untied.

This is how I experience music on a spiritual level. I am honored to call God my BIG boss and to call all his people my supervisors. Because by ministering to the people my vision becomes "super", not just focused on myself. That would be an inferior way to practice Church Music. In conclusion, I ask that everyone who attends the First Congregational Church UCC in Saugus feel free to speak with me about their own musical and spiritual experiences so that I can widen my scope of understanding. I appreciate hearing your hearts of joy, sadness, disappointment or whatever feelings you may be experiencing and in turn, I will translate that into what I hope to be a transformative musical experience.
