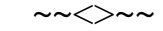

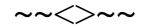

They each had their own personalities and came with owner's manual, story, birth place, bio wit favorite sport, favorite school, etc plus post card. The doors opened, wheels rolled, eyes rolled when car was pressed down.

They stopped producing cars in 2011.
