FOSTA-SESTA WILL FIGHT TRAFFICKING

The National Council of Jewish Women is encouraged by the passage and signing into law of **FOSTA Fight Online Sex Trafficking Act** and **SESTA-Stop Enabling Sex Trafficking Act**, an anti-trafficking package that will make it possible to prosecute websites that knowingly facilitate sex trafficking. The spread of sex trafficking and child pornography through online platforms, including mainstream platforms, has been a significant factor in victimizing minors and others held by force or threat of force in terrible situations. Facilitating sex trafficking online or otherwise is criminal activity and must be punished.

NCJW is heartened that Congress and the President have taken these important steps to combat sex trafficking. While FOSTA-SESTA does not complete our work, it propels our activists and our partners nationwide to continue the complex federal, state, and local responses necessary to tackle the root causes, of trafficking and the conditions that allow it to take place. The seizure of Backpage.com and its affiliates by the Justice Department is the first positive action as a direct result of the FOSTA-SESTA passage in Congress. Hopefully it will be the first of many actions to protect the women and children who are caught in the trafficking web.

The SE Atlantic Section is very proud to announce the establishment of a Community Kid's Closet at Orchard View Elementary School. Thanks to our shoppers "extraordinaire," Starr Lipson and Hindy Melzer, we were able to supply Orchard View with much needed girl's clothing.

Our Kid's Community Closets help both students and the teachers by providing clothing necessities. The children can be less self-conscious and have a smaller risk of being teased or bullied. Both teacher and student can focus on learning. We select schools based on the percentage of students who receive free or reduced price meals; this is the federal measure of poverty. Our Kid's Closet is there when an emergency happens. We can supply pants, collared shirts, and underpants. These items are kept by the child for their future use. We work with school administrators to determine each child's needs. The Section is looking forward to opening additional Kid's Closets in September.
