Utah Road Usage Charge Report As required by Senate Bill 150



Utah roads are primarily maintained using taxes from fuel sales. As vehicles become more fuel efficient and the number of alternative fuel vehicles grows, Utah is analyzing new ways to fund its transportation system. One way is to charge roadway users for the miles they drive as opposed to the fuel they use. Utah implemented a version of this in 2020: Utah's Road Usage Charge Program.

In 2020, the Utah Legislature adopted Senate Bill 150, which directed UDOT to prepare a report to policy makers with a plan to enroll all qualified vehicles in Utah in the program by December 31, 2031. UDOT and its partners have prepared a report that outlines two primary scenarios to accomplish full qualified vehicle enrollment by the end of 2031.
