

MYASTHENIA GRAVIS MEDICATIONS TO USE WITH CAUTION

This list is not comprehensive and these drugs may affect each person differently.

Please check with your neurologist before surgeries or adding medications.

Key:

- 1 Contraindicated. Avoid in MG patients, even if disease is controlled.
- 2 Likely to worsen MG. Systemic administration should only be done in a hospital where ventilation support is available.
- 3 May worsen MG. Usually is well tolerated but use with caution.
- 4 Have caused problems in rare cases. Usually not a problem for the majority of MG patients.
- 5 Have been shown to cause an autoimmune, temporary form of MG.
