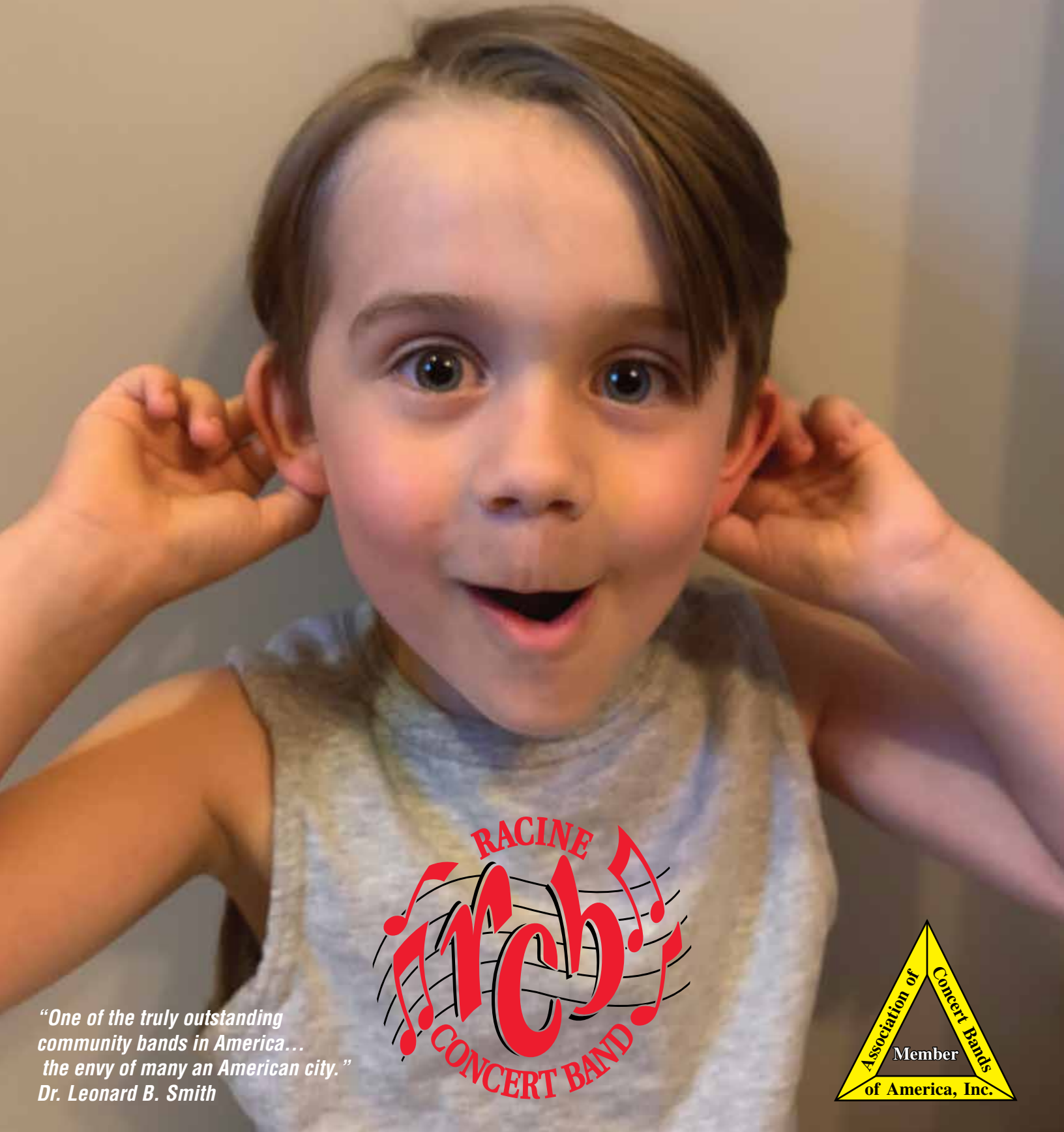

Welcome back!



Mark Eichner

Since 2002, Mark Eichner has served as Music Director and Conductor of the Racine Concert Band, the tenth band to be awarded the Sousa Foundation "Sudler Scroll" for outstanding artistic achievement by a community band. As a trumpeter, he has performed in the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, the Wisconsin Philharmonic, the Florentine Opera, Present Music, the Brass Band of Battle Creek, the Chicagoland Pops Orchestra, the Woodstock Mozart Festival, and the Skylight Opera Theater. As the leader of "BrassWorks", quintet performances include a nationally broadcast recital at the Dame Myra Hess Concerts in Chicago, concerts assisting the Canadian Brass, and university and civic festival concerts in Illinois and Wisconsin. His brass ensemble performances include ceremonial music welcoming visiting dignitaries, including President George H.W. Bush, Nobel Prize winner Bishop Desmond Tutu, Senators Herb Kohl and William Proxmire, Governor Tommy Thompson, and U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala. He presented a lecture-demonstration on the band music of Pulitzer Prize winning composer Robert Ward, at a College Band Directors National Association convention in 2014.

A music educator for 41 years, he was the Wind Ensemble conductor and trumpet instructor at UW-Parkside for 32 years, where he founded the UW-Parkside Community Band, the WSMA State Solo &

Ensemble Contest, and the Summer Arts & Crafts Festival, funding hundreds of student grants. He was department Chair from 1998-2007, and received a UW Regents' Award for Teaching Excellence in 1993.

Prior to his appointment at UW-Parkside, he taught at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma and in the Austin, Texas public schools. He earned the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees at the University of Texas. His principal teachers were Tom Lee in conducting, Richard Metzger and Frank Elsass in trumpet, and Cathy Kaiser in Alexander Technique.
