We are excited to welcome the Tiny Houses of HOPE Pilot Project (THoHPP) Steering Committee to Lutheran Church of the Savior this Sunday, December 8, immediately after worship.

The purpose of this free, family-friendly event is to learn more about one of the most innovative and achievable affordable housing projects taking place in the coming year. The pilot project will build a half dozen 400 sq. ft. tiny homes in Kalamazoo's northside neighborhood, based on a model currently underway in Detroit. The project looks at the two most notable contributors to relapse and recidivism, which are housing and employment. The two factors account for 87 percent success rate in adults with criminal history background or substance abuse disorder. The project will tackle both head-on.

Come learn more about this project and consider supporting this organization's mission. In addition to learning more about the project, you will have an opportunity to contribute financially if you feel so moved. We will provide a lunch and dessert to those who attend. We hope to see you after worship this Sunday, December 8.

<u>Pastor Nikki Newsletter</u>

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being." – John 1:1-3

Grace and peace to you!

It seems appropriate as we prepare to celebrate the Word made flesh on Christmas Day that the next part of worship, I want to discuss is the reading of God's Word in worship. During worship: the reading of God's Word. During our worship service we usually have four

readings from Holy Scripture. We have a reading from the Old Testament, we chant a Psalm, we hear from one of the Epistles (letters) in the New Testament, and then we have a reading from one of the Gospels.

This might not sound unusual but for parts of Christian history where only certain selections of the Bible might be read or very little Scripture at all! Before the printing press Bibles were rare because they had to be handwritten and were very expensive. Bibles were also only written in Latin until Martin Luther translated the Bible into German. Later after the printing press made books inexpensive to produce the Bible would be translated in thousands of different languages.

During worship we have four Bible readings. We have an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, a reading from one of the Epistles (letters) of the New Testament, and a Gospel reading. This means over the course of a three-year cycle we get through most of the Bible. It is important to spend time reading and hearing the Bible because the Bible is God's love letter to us.



Holy Scripture helps us grow in our relationship with God, it helps us learn how God calls us to live in the world, it guides us in how we worship, and it helps us learn our identity as disciples of Jesus.

One interesting thing to be aware of is that there is no such thing as THE Bible. Christians use different Bibles which can have different books or stories in them, and there are thousands of translations of the Bible out there that different groups use. For example, most Protestants have 66 books in their Bibles, Ethiopian Orthodox Christians have hundreds of books in their Bibles, Roman Catholics have 7 more books than most Protestants, and Lutherans did not formally dismiss the 7 books that Roman Catholics use and occasionally some of them come up as options for worship.



Sometimes the Bible can have challenging or uncertain meanings and that can cause division and tension on what to do with the reading. As you read the Bible and come across

challenging stories or passages remember above all that God loves and desires all people to be part of God's family.

We are called to struggle and wrestle with hard Bible passages knowing that sometimes it will not be as clear or easy as we would like, but we can always look to the Nativity or Crucifixion stories if we ever have doubt about how much God loves us. I am also more than happy to talk about the Bible and especially about difficult passages anytime.

I hope that if you have not before you will take time to read the Bible cover to cover. I have included a helpful Daily Bible Reading Program if you would like to join me in reading the whole Bible in 2020 (attached). Each day has a few chapters of the Bible to read so that it does not get too overwhelming, and you can do it alone or with a group of friends!
