Several ladies in the church have been making Teddy Bears and Surgical Dolls for Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters for quite a few years now. The group was started by Ena Reed as part of an UMW Circle. It meets the last Tuesday of each month at 10 AM. You bring your brown bag lunch with you and after a couple of

hours of sewing, stuffing and cutting out teddies and dolls you enjoy a time of fellowship.

The group has gotten smaller but the work output has not. In September the ladies completed 43 bears, 1 surgical doll and 2 blankets. Each child who has surgery at CHKD's gets a Teddy to accompany them and ease the anxiety. The doll is used by the doctors to explain the more difficult surgeries.

- 1. Measure and cut enough ribbon to wrap around the jar's neck, below the lid. Glue in place and let dry.
- 2. Fold each piece of paper in half three times, resulting in eight rectangles per sheet. Cut along the fold lines, and you'll have 24 rectangles.
- 3. Each day in November until Thanksgiving, write down one blessing from God. Then place that blessing in the jar.
- 4. On Thanksgiving, open the jar and read all your blessings to your family and friends.




My Heart Small Group
