In God's Time

Why is the Pastor so slow at making a decision with...?

Often, I'm asked why something isn't moving forward as fast as was expected. To answer this isn't easy. Are there times I'm just lazy and slow? Absolutely! Most of the time there are other reasons and too often I can't share them. But for this article I'll give a few ways this happens.

First every decision needs to be made after prayer. Yes, I really do pray! I pray in the morning, evening, and many times doing the day. I often wait and discern for an answer. Sometimes discerning what that answer is just isn't easy. What I've learned is truly it is God's timing and not mine.

I also look how whatever the issue is will affect the church ministry, how it will affect our members, and most importantly how it will affect our mission. What I've learned is you can only please some of the people some of the time, and you just can't please everyone. I truly do look at the big Picture.

Sadly, I look at where our budget is, and what ministries are competing for our funds. The perfect example is the Bell Choir and Hiring a Youth Minister. Both were brought up at consistory and both good ideas. I put the brakes on the Youth Minister Position for a while as we raise funds for the bells. For every three people that came to me in support of the bells there were three against it. For every three people in support of the Youth Minister that came to me, there were three against it. I have prayed long and hard on both ministries. Both are good, both are necessary to our well-being. Again, God's timing! What I've learned is to stay faithful, prayerful, and to have a thick skin.

Lastly, I often don't answer or respond because I can't. Either there is no money, or a confidentiality issue, or another issue I'm not privileged to share. What I've learned is God will work it out, it will be ok, and God is good-all the time. Where there is a need God will provide a way.

Above all know that your Pastor prays, your Pastor does the best to remain faithful to God's will, and your Pastor loves and cares for you. So again, I pray..." dear Lord, help us to remain a loving caring church, help us to prayerfully discern your will, and help us most importantly to remain faithful.
