FROM THE PASTOR

August 11, 2019
Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Lk 12:32-48

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

"Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy" (Luke 12:33). When I was a kid, I had a treasure of an electronic baseball video game. One day, I went to take it out of the drawer, and it didn't work. The batteries had leaked acid onto the circuit board and ruined it. Maybe I hadn't played it for a long time, or the KY humidity got to it, but it was definitely ruined. That is the way of usual childhood novelties. **I thought it was a treasure, but where did it end up?** But, what about my **human team-mates** on our grade school baseball team? They are the most valuable. I still see them around and run into them today. **They are the real treasure!** I think this is what Jesus is saying in the gospel about us working for eternal treasures. What lasts? Not toys, stuff, trends and fashions. (Who has wished that their childhood baseball card collections could have been preserved?). Of course, what lasts is God, human souls, and our relationship to them. Our relationship to God is eternal. Everything we have, and all we are is dependent upon God (the sooner we learn that, the more content we are!). Even just being here is a gift from God! And other people? They, too, are gifts created by God. That is our inexhaustible treasure: God and our relationship to Him and His people, each other. Priceless. These money bags (people-treasures and God) do not wear out. Our spiritual bank account amounts to the many acts of generosity and good work offered at Jesus' command. Following Jesus, loving and being loved as He is, (loving God and neighbor) multiplies our heavenly investment in the eternal things of God. In Luke 12:34, Jesus says, "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." The movement of our heart is what is remembered and lasts. Here is an example. Think of an act of love you have given to or received from another person recently. We may not remember the physical gifts, but we always remember the thoughtfulness of caring and being cared for by them. The relationship is what is remembered. Our belonging to God and being family with all of His created children is eternal and enduring.

Once when Peter was looking for an easy life to avoid holding the cross, Jesus reprimanded him saying "You are not setting your mind on **the things of God**, but on the things of man" (Mark 8:33). These "things of God" are heavenly treasure. Peter was seeking physical comfort, popularity and wealth. Jesus was saying that God's Kingdom requires effort, humility and work. Heavenly treasure amounts to valuing God and keeping God's priorities, more than this world's. Works of God include being humble and disciplined, serving and caring for God's people, especially those not able to care for themselves (the poor, the infirm, the left out and the looked down upon). God has us build real relationships, not real estate. He desires us to conduct works of compassion for others, not workshop campaigns for our own enrichment. His eternal kingdom is realized in loving concern for others, not us protecting our selfish interests and security. The Kingdom is 'go serve others' not 'go fund me'. It may help to look at the Sermon on the Mount where Jesus speaks about heavenly reward. In Matthew 5:12, Jesus says, "Rejoice and be glad, for **your reward will be great in heaven**". Well, what is the **reward**? Verse 3 and 10 open and close this teaching like bookends, by repeating, "The kingdom is yours." So, the Kingdom is the reward, but what does the kingdom consist of? I notice that each of the remaining beatitude verses describes a *piece* of 'Kingdom Life'. Verse 4 offers the reward of comforting peace. Verse 5 speaks of inheriting the land and its life-secrets of growth. Verse 6 promises satisfaction and contentment. Verse 7 offers living mercy, both giving + receiving. Verse 8 hints of seeing God, and verse 9 declares that God claim us as His very children! That is worth eternity!

What is your treasure? I heard a priest once say that our treasure is revealed by examining both 1) our appointment calendar and 2) our bank statements. How we use our time and how we spend our income reveals our values and what is in our hearts. When we consider how precious and irreplaceable people are, and how God has no price tag in relating to Him, we likely feel just as St Paul does when he writes to the Philippians in 3:7, "whatever gains I thought I had, these I have come to consider a loss because of Christ." Compared alongside Christ, nothing in this world comes close. "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him," (1 Corinthians 2:9). So as good as we may think we are treasuring heavenly reward, in fact, we've come nowhere near close enough to imagining God's truly abundant treasure. So much the better for us, then, to continue striving for & seeking the good things of God!
