1Th 5:11 Wherefore comfort yourselves together, and edify one another, even as also ye do.

1Co 14:17 For thou verily givest thanks well, but the other is not edified.

My thoughts circled around the above verse yesterday and here is what developed. The contest of the verse is dealing with church meetings pertaining to praying, exhorting, singing and ministry of the Spirit of God.

The work of the church as the Apostle Paul preached it was for the perfecting of the saints and edifying of the body of Christ Eph 4:13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

Some Christians today are being spiritually tapped out and they need to plug the drain hole or maybe it's the inlet valve where the faith is being plunged out by the cares of this life.

Being built up in the faith might require shock to the spiritual muscle of the heart. Eph 4:16 From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, **maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love**.
