And for some years, board games were quite popular. Many evenings were spent as a family, moving some game piece around a board with the roll of the dice or the draw of a card.

So what did I learn from all this? For many generations, that mid winter time between major holidays wasn't a time of hibernation or dull stagnation by any means. It was a time for family, friends, and neighbors, to take a pause and do something for a little winter fun together.

LENT 2016

During Lent this year we will be following the theme of *Living Lent* <u>As People of the Resurrection.</u>

Each week we'll look at another part of the Passion story of Christ. We'll see how the narrative takes on even more meaning for us when we look at the story through the lens of the empty tomb. We'll see how we are always alive in Christ, who died and was raised. We'll also offer a Lenten study group that will look even more closely at our worship theme each week. This study group will meet each Monday morning from 10:00am – 12:00noon beginning on February 8th and continuing through March 14th. Here is a look at the schedule for our worship and study:

Ash Wednesday, February 10th – **PONDER** – Luke 5: 27-32 Lent is a time to ponder our relationship with God and with one another, to discover the love of God seen in the cross and the empty tomb.

Week 1, February 14th – **PURPOSE** – Luke 19: 1-10 This season is a time to find God's purpose for our lives, fulfilled in our redemption by Jesus, who seeks and saves the lost and gives us new life.

Week 2, February 21st – **PEOPLE** – John 10: 14-18 We are called to be among people in this world. People matter to God; he sent Jesus to save them. People should also matter to us, we are sent to love them.

Week 3, February 28th – **PROCLAIM** – 1 Peter 2: 9-10 To proclaim the story of Christ is to paint a picture of the God who seeks and embraces us. Our proclamation of the Savior brings faith to life.

Week 4, March 6th – **PRAISE** – Psalm 34: 1-10 Even in the midst of sorrow, we are called to celebrate the love of God and the joy that can be found only in Christ crucified, who reigns in glory now.

Week 5, March 13th – **PAIN** – Luke 15: 11-32 & 23: 26-49 The pain of rejection and the pain of a father when a son leaves are juxtaposed against the reckless love of God revealed in Jesus, who wipes every tear from our eyes.

Palm Sunday, March 20th – **PALMS** – Luke 19: 28-30 We who know the resurrection is on the horizon welcome the King of Glory, now humble riding on a donkey.

Maundy Thursday, March 24th – **PRAYER** – Luke 22: 14-23, 39-46 We watch as Jesus prays in anguish that this cup might pass from him, aware that God's plan for him is glorious.

Good Friday, March 25th – **PASSION** – Luke 23 We witness the passion and death of Christ on the cross, knowing that by his death we have everlasting life.

Easter Sunday, March 27th – **PARADISE** – Luke 24: 1-12 As Easter people, we rejoice in the end of the story: paradise is ours through the resurrection of Christ.

On Sunday, January 17th we celebrated the many missions and ministries go into making our church such a vibrant and caring center for worship and outreach. In that spirit, I thought it might be interesting to highlight a different aspect of our food pantry mission in this and upcoming newsletters, to better illustrate that in fact "It Takes a Village" to fulfill our mission to reach out to those in need and give food to the hungry and & drink to the thirsty. It really is amazing to see how all the pieces come together to make it all happen and more importantly how our church is at the center of it all! I hope you enjoy the series. Here's the first installment of...

> A Week in the Life of the Brewerton Community Food Pantry The Bread of LIFE – Our Bread Mission!

<u>Monday</u>

The week begins with an invitation to pick up "left over" BJS bread and baked goods from Anna's Pantry at Sacred Heart Church in Cicero. Anna's Pantry usually receives an abundance of items on Monday mornings from BJs in Clay as a recipient of their Feeding America – BJS Feeding Communities Program. After sharing the vast assortment of breads, cakes, pies, bagels, donuts, etc., with their clients during their Monday afternoon pantry hours, they often have an assortment of left over items that remain fresh, delicious and are perfect for distribution to OUR pantry clients on Tuesday mornings. We are so very thankful to have this partnership with a neighboring, local food pantry that allows us to provide our clients with a greater selection of items. As an added benefit, our pantry receives ALL the BJs baked goods on Monday Holidays, when the Sacred Heart Pantry is closed. Recently, on January 18th (Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Birthday,) I loaded my entire SUV full of bakery items – pies, cakes, muffins, bagels, breads of all kinds, cupcakes and more! I was overwhelmed by the quantity and quality of items 3 huge shopping carts full!

Every Monday, between 10:15 and 10:30 p.m., a team of volunteers arrive in the darkness of night at the pantry with 4+ bins filled with breads, bagels, cookies, pastries, etc. donated by Panera Bread on Route 11 in Cicero. Panera's donations to local hunger relief through their "Day-End Dough-Nation" program gives our pantry access to all unsold bread and baked goods every Monday night! What a blessing that is to be able to share "designer baked goods" with our clients each week! I'd like to recognize the teams that volunteer to perform this task on a rotating basis each month: Jerry & Kathy Martin, Betty & Tom Macera, Karin & John King, Leslie & Mike Cortese, Jennifer Pluta, Lennie & Tom Belge, Pam & Joe Delaney and Deb & Ron Lombard.

<u>Tuesday</u>

Each Tuesday, a team of volunteers arrive at the food pantry as early as 8:00 a.m. to sort, bag, wrap and display the multitude of baked goods for the clients to partake in when they arrive at the pantry. The volunteers, Jean & Lloyd Stahl and Barb Russo spend an hour or more, preparing the bread and goodies for distribution. The tables in the Fellowship room are lined with bins and boxes filled with a wide assortment of yummy treats and wholesome breads. They add their own special touches to arranging the inventory so that it resembles a bakery department! In addition, our clients have access to 20 to 30 boxes of wholesale bread through the Food Bank of CNY, that we receive twice a month when we place our food orders. Our bread room is open to pantry clients and others in the community every Tuesday and Thursday during pantry hours and it has become a welcome area for our pantry clients to visit and enjoy.

Thursday


Between 12:30 & 1:30 every Thursday afternoon, a truck carrying bread, dairy, frozen meats, and fresh produce as part of Grocery Rescue program, sponsored by the Food Bank of CNY, arrives in our parking lot. A team of volunteers and community service workers, are invited to take possession of any and all of the boxes stored in the refrigerated truck for distribution in our pantry. Our team of volunteers include: Terri Reardon, Amie (our coupon expert,) Dawn and her aide from Advocates, and Steve, a community service candidate. The bread and bakery items that are typically included in the Grocery Rescue shipment come from a variety of retailers: Wal-Mart, BJs, and Trader Joe's and are FREE for the taking. Fresh produce, dairy and frozen meats are also available to us and will be featured in a future newsletter article. At the close of pantry, between 6:30 & 7:00 p.m. every Thursday, Farmer Tom from his farm on Gunther Road, takes all the stale bread and bakery items to share with his pigs and other animals. So you see, nothing goes to waste! It's the circle of LIFE!

<u>Saturday</u>

In addition, we receive donated bread and bakery items from Price Chopper on Route 31 in Clay every Saturday morning at 8:00. A team of volunteers (yes, another team...do you see a pattern here??) loads their SUV, truck or van with bins filled with bakery items and transports them to the food pantry for distribution. Lauren & Bob Lalley serve as the team leaders – training and scheduling each team for the task. The teams include: Jane, Jenna & Jerry McGrath, Maureen & Gerry Lowe, Michele & Joe Marlow as well as Lauren & Bob Lalley. The Price Chopper donations were first made available to our food pantry by the late Lester Collins through his contacts at the store. Lester's son, Wayne Collins, helped us to maintain our relationship with Price Chopper after Lester's passing. And, it remains intact today! We are forever grateful for the items that we receive each week to share with our clients.

Stay tuned...our next installment of *A Week in the Life of the Brewerton Community Food Pantry* where we will highlight the role the Food Bank of CNY plays in securing food for our pantry through the many programs they sponsor. Thank you for your continued support of our food pantry mission. TOGETHER we are making a DIFFERENCE in the LIVES of MANY!!!
