

Villages of Devonshire Approved Plants List

This list represents the plants that have been approved for planting in Devonshire. Should you desire a plant not yet approved, include the plant on your DRB application and the DRB will research the plant. Should the plant be approved, it will be added to the list.

Note: It is the intent of the Design Review Board to limit the planting of palm trees within Devonshire in accordance with City of Tampa criteria. A maximum of three (3) palms, each measuring 14" minimum of DBH and eight (8) feet clear trunk height will count towards one (1) canopy tree. It is recommended that palms only be used as accents to supplement the plantings of trees and to give appropriate scale to vertical structures.
