I appreciate very clear directions. I like to know exactly how to do something – that way I don't have to guess about whatever it is and I'll have less of a chance to mess it up. I'm not a perfectionist or anything like that – I just want to do things correctly the first time. I appreciate directions and clear descriptions of what I'm getting into. I appreciate knowing the boundaries and limits of something and I'm really okay with tests that demonstrate my knowledge about a theory, organization, or system. Knowing that about myself, how in the world did I end up as an ordained minister of the United Church of Christ? How did a direction-loving, 'show me the boundaries' rules follower and test taker like me end up in a denomination that removes the 'rules' from identifying oneself as a follower of Christ? I wonder how many of us UCC'ers wonder the same thing. As a denomination, the UCC claims to be a church of testimony not of tests. We are assured that we do not have to pass a test or sign off on a specific set of beliefs to be a member or friend of a congregation. I thank God that I found my way to this denomination. While some in our congregation, myself included, came to the UCC later in life, many in our congregation were born into the UCC (or one of the denominations that became the UCC in 1957). Like many things in life, our faith journeys are varied and filled with interesting and formative experiences. How wonderful that our journeys have brought us together here, at Hope UCC.

As I met with our newest members in July, we discussed the history of the UCC. In that meeting I was reminded of the importance and substance of the UCC Statement of Faith. It was then that I knew our worship series theme this Fall would focus on the UCC Statement of Faith and what it means to us as followers of Christ. I look forward to exploring our Statement of Faith together for the next six weeks.

Reel Theology September 9: Katrina Babies

Sixteen years after Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans, an entire generation still grapples with the lifelong impact of having their childhood redefined by tragedy. New Orleans filmmaker Edward Buckles Jr., who was 13 years old during Katrina and its initial aftermath, spent seven years documenting the stories of his peers who survived the storm as children, using his community's tradition of oral storytelling to open a door for healing and to capture the strength and spirit of his city.

Hurricane Katrina hit in late August of 2005 and caused the deaths of at least 1,836 people. We are kicking off Reel Theology with this documentary as we commemorate the 17th anniversary of this natural and national disaster.
