If anyone needs pastoral care, they should contact the Deacons. There is a specific phone number (701-353-2020) for pastoral care which will directly be answered by a Deacon. The plan is to have the number recorded on the CPC phone message. Of course, anyone may also contact individual Deacons directly. Additionally, the Deacons will reach out to local pastors and CPC elders regarding their availability for providing specialized pastoral care.

We realize that there are others in need beyond our congregation whom we will need to help. Many people enter the church with physical and emotional needs beyond what CPC is normally able to give. The Deacons will put together a resource folder detailing purpose and help available from groups and entities in the FM area who benefit those in need. We would like to move an unused Christian Education cupboard upstairs for the sole purpose of providing accessible emergency amenities for the needy who pass in our doors. Water bottles, energy bars, a First Link card would be included in said bundles. The Deacons' folder would be stored there as would a fully stocked first aid kit. Further discussions on this matter will be coordinated with other committees with the same interest.






For a second year in a row, our CPC Softball Team is the year's Twin City Church Softball League Tournament Champion!
