



Crow Wing Crest Lodge was built in 1898 as one of 25 logging camps in the area for the Red River Logging Company, (co-founded by H.C. Akeley and T.B. Walker) who created Paul Bunyan tales as part of a marketing campaign to sell their lumber.

Our lodge is still used today as gathering place and activity center for our guests. Crooked original wooden floors and wavy vintage glass paned windows add to our traditional Mom # Pop 'up north' resort setting.

We encourage you to increase your well being by hanging out with us at this peaceful family vacation retreat. Enjoy the lake, the long, sandy beach, onsite hiking trails, loons and chipmunks. Or really includge in relaxation with a reflexology session or aromatherapy class with owners.

In 1999 shortly after graduating from college she began selling her handmade beads and jewelry to boutiques and at trade and art shows. Eventually she built a larger studio and at the request of customers opened it to the public seasonally.

In 2004 a group of teachers from the Akeley area developed the Akeley Community Library in the former home economics classroom of the old Akeley School. Grants were written, books were purchased and donated; soon the former school library bookshelves were overflowing with reading choices from preschool through adult, including recent best

sellers. We are fortunate to July 14 & 28, and August have dedicated community members serve as volunteer librarians and have the financial support of local organizations.
