



Sponsors needed


<u>Have a special birthday or</u> anniversary coming up???

As we look ahead to Spring I am reminded that this year will be the **50**th **Anniversary of Earth Day – April 22, 2020**.

For many of you this may not be significant but when you think of what God's world would be like without the beauty and wonder of all of creation I know it means a lot to me that some folks care enough to try to preserve and protect what God intended for all.

The ELCA issued a social statement in 1997 – 27 yrs ago called

Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice.

This social statement explains the ELCA's teachings on ecology and the environment, grounded in a biblical vision of God's intention for the healing and wholeness of creation. This statement provides a Christian understanding of the human role to serve in creation, and a hope rooted in God's faithfulness to the creation from which humans emerge and depend upon for sustaining life. It provides a framework for understanding the human role in creation, the problem of sin and the current environmental crisis.
