Facts of 16th and 17th of Tammuz

The 16th of Tammuz (26 June 2021) is the date before the day that Moses comes down from Mount Sinai with the stone tablets. Moses has been absent for 40 days and the people are restless and angry. They are convinced that 40 days have passed. They ask Aaron, who is experienced in gold to make them a symbol of the divine they can see and touch. Aaron makes them a Golden Calf (Exodus 32:1).

Hur, an Israelite leader, is the son of Caleb and Miriam (Babylonian Talmud Sotah 11b). Hur objects to the calf saying that the people are ungrateful to the Divine. In anger the mob attacks Hur and kills him. A terrified Aaron sees the murder and does what the mob wants in order to save his own life (Exodus Rabbah 41:7).

Violence in the name of religion is one of the great scourges of the world. Yet in the bible, it is Moses and the Levites who kill those who built the Golden Calf and allow Aaron who acted in duress to live. Concisely, Moses and the Levites show their won unwillingness to tolerate a spiritual practice that angers them. In the months of Tammuz and Av we seek peace among religious traditions as well as nations and individuals.

The 17th of Tammuz is a fast day from sunrise to sunset. It is a day of devastation in ancient Jerusalem. The Talmud tells us it was the day on which Moses, angry over the building of the Golden Calf, broke the stone tablets on which the commandments were written. All that is deemed eternal breaks and falls on the 17th of Tammuz. This day begins a period of mourning known as the Three Weeks, 21 days, culminating with the fast of the ninth of Av.

The shattered walls of Jerusalem; the defiled Temple in the year 70AD; and the broken tablets all represent events that our people held sacred. Events caused by mistrust and violence. Always remember, never to forget, that there is always hope and repair. Yes repair is our main work in the world: to put back together that which was destroyed and as we pray in our daily prayers rebuild our Temple again.
