The Key to Understanding Easter

As you receive this month's Witness, Holy Week and Easter stand just around the corner. Pastors of the Mission District and Lay Associates Ministers will be gathering for worship to renew their ordination vows and their call to the Office of Word and Service on Tuesday of Holy Week at a service we know as the Chrism Mass. Remember your pastors in your prayers not only during Holy Week, but every week. They are worthy of your very best encouragement and support; their calling is not easy. We have some of the finest pastors in the congregations of our Mission District that I have had the privilege to know over the forty years of my ministry.

To enter into the joy of Easter takes great courage whether one is clergy or laity. One must bend down and look into the empty tomb like the disciples and see that He has Risen. What do you mean by this some might ask? One must be prepared to see what one does not expect. Do you see the "Glory of Christ or the false glory of the world?"

Last Easter Pope Francis spoke profound words about Easter and humility. He stated that Jesus, "by His death and resurrection shows everyone the way to life and happiness: this way is humility." This is the path which leads to glory. Only those who humble themselves can go toward the "things that are above," toward God.

To enter into the mystery of God's love we need to bend down in love and service in Christ's Name to one another. Only those who humble themselves understand the glorification of Jesus that Easter is about and are able to follow Him in the way of glory.

Obviously that often involves being countercultural. Instead of putting ourselves first we Christians by the grace of Christ, crucified and risen, become the seeds by which God raises up those around us to new life. It takes humility to live in service to one another, not to be arrogant, but rather respectful, forgiving, and ready to act first to bring peace, comfort, hope, and help to those around us for Christ's sake. This is not weakness, but true strength.

Those who bear within them God's power, His love and His justice, do not need to have others tell them how great they are, do not need to insist on being "right," do not need to be served, they take others sins upon themselves and respond with grace. For when they look in the tomb they know that God serves them with grace, mercy and compassion beyond comprehension. Those who bend down in this way speak and act with the power of truth, beauty and love. We cannot live Easter without entering into this mystery of faith. It is not something intellectual, more than a promise we trust for salvation, more than hope for tomorrow. It is so much more! Entering into the mystery of faith means being able to wonder, to contemplate that Resurrection Life dwells within us and our congregations.

I pray that all in our Mission District and all in Christ's Church may see His Glory this Easter.

NALC Disaster Response Task Force is providing disaster preparedness training at Level One Basic and Level Two Specialized. These educational workshops will provide training to volunteers in each participating congregation, preparing each to form disaster volunteer teams. The vision is that each Mission District assist in the formation of teams and the preparedness training. Recognized credentials will be provided.

Disaster Volunteer training includes components on:

<u>Level One</u> - unskilled disaster response for debris removal and basic information on FEMA regulations

Level Two - specialized trainings including:

- Case Management/Coordinated Assistance Network how to identify and track client needs and the assistance they receive - BECOME A VOLUNTEER CASE MANAGER!
- Donations Management/Aid Matrix how to coordinate and organize donated materials -
- Volunteer Management/Disaster Response Database how to identify the skills of each volunteer and address risk management issues – FORM A DISASTER VOLUNTEER TEAM & HELP REBUILD **HOMES!**
- Spiritual and Emotional Care how to identify and document qualified volunteers to provide spiritual care - PROVIDE SPIRITUAL CARE TO THOSE HURTING AND IN NEED - THOSE AFFECTED BY DISASTER AS WELL AS TEAM MEMBERS!

Dean's Notes

- +Pastor Nila Cogan and Pastor Carl Johnson have been appointed to serve as Assistants to the Dean of The Mid-Northeast Mission District in 2016. I am grateful for their continued faithful and excellent leadership.
- +At the Orlando Florida NALC Leaders and Ministerium Meeting this past month Dr. David Yeago reported that consideration of a Three-Fold Office of Ministry of Ordained Ministry including a ministry of Word and Service continues to be under study. How we make sense of an Office of Ministry that does not include Word and Sacrament is problematic both for us as Lutherans and ecumenically. Should the Office of Ministry be other than Word and Sacrament? How does our biblical-theological understanding of this issue and our polity best serve the ministry of the Gospel as we move forward in being part of the holy, catholic, apostolic Church? How will our understanding of ecclesiology effect our relationship with the Roman Catholic Church, the Anglican Church and Missouri Synod, etc. The NALC Study Commission is not yet close to a recommended position for our annual convocation to consider but is working toward that goal.
- +Also from our Orlando NALC Leadership Meeting New NALC Communications Coordinator, Pastor Mark Ryman, has been asked to prioritize developing a website program available to all our congregations so that every NALC congregation small or large can have an effective website ministry engaging their community. A standard and premium user-friendly website program has just been designed and developed for our churches at a nominal cost. It looks good. I encourage you to consider it as you evaluate the effectiveness of your website ministry.
- +Chrism Mass and Renewal of Ordination Vows will be held at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Butler, PA at 11:00 AM on Tuesday, March 22nd followed by lunch provided for pastors and Lay Associates of the Mission District at the Monroe Hotel following the service. Oil to be blessed for Baptism and Healing of the Sick may be brought to the service.
- +Pastor Karl Schoch has been appointed by the Dean to serve as Interim (Vice-Pastor) to Springdale Lutheran Church in West Sunbury. Thanks to Pastor Carl Hendrickson and Pastor Sandra Towberman for their good and faithful ministry to the congregation these past three years.
- +Interim Ministry Guidelines (Providing Pastoral Care for Congregations in Transition of the Mid-Northeast Mission District of the NALC) have been approved by the Executive Council.
- +To grow their ministry, Christ Lutheran Church in East Amherst, New York, a mission congregation of our Mission District of under the pastoral leadership of Pastor Mack Smith is holding a congregation retreat with NALC General Secretary, Pastor Mark Chavez, April 23-24. The retreat will be followed by a weekend visit from Dr. Amy Schifrin with emphasis on church growth and ministry on May 21-22. The Mission District Executive Council will be meeting with leaders of the congregation for our next Executive Council meeting on June 22-23 when making a road trip to visit congregations in the northeast part of the Mission District. Congratulations to Christ Lutheran in its desire to step out in faith to learn, serve and grow!
- +The Mission District Executive Council has approved a special collection among our churches during Lent to help the family Pastor Emery Barnett with medical expenses prior to Pastor Barnett's death this fall.
- +Bishop Bradosky has announced that a "Church Planting/House Church Planting Seminar" will be held this coming fall. Each of our Mission District's has been asked to plant at least one new mission start in 2016.
- +l serve on the NALC Task Force to consider revision of the NALC election process for bishop. I welcome your thoughts.
- +Christian Associates of Southwestern Pennsylvania, representing the judicatory leaders of 27 denominations including the NALC has moved its offices from Lawrenceville to the campus of the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.

 The March meeting of the Council of Bishops and Judicatory leaders will be held at the new offices.
