## Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition

### Our Purpose and Objectives

• To increase access to social services and counseling services.

• To increase access to youth programming.

• To partner with existing stakeholders such as the school district and Shippensburg University to meet educational and community needs.

The SCRC was started in 2010 in response to the growing need to help residents find and utilize social services. Shippensburg falls between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland which means that services can be difficult for community members to access if the services extend to Shippensburg at all. The Resource Coalition has brought service providers and community members together since this time, with the aim of connecting clients with resources as well as developing programs to meet needs.

The SCRC is a Shippensburg University Center For Excellence and serves as a "learning lab" for the university. Students, Faculty, and staff are involved in our work and have initiated many of our programs and services. We also provide a bridge for building community-university relationships. # The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away

from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!



Today is the first Sunday of Lent and a new church season. Father Ben will be wearing purple which tells us that we are getting ready for something special. **Do you know what** 

#### the something special is?

There will be no Ġloria or Alleluia because those are songs of joy. Lent is the time to reflect on what sin is and to remember that Jesus triumphed over sin by his suffering, death and resurrection.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is in the desert and is tempted three times by the devil. The devil offered Jesus things that looked really good: power, riches and protection from suffering. You can understand that some people would like these things, but Jesus would have had to turn away from God's path if he had listened to Satan. Jesus knew Scripture with his mind and heart and when he used Scripture as a response to temptation, he understood its true purpose and how it fit into God's love.

Jesus spent forty days in the desert fasting. Fasting



means to give up something that we like or want as a way of prayer and to get closer to God. We should all do some type of fasting: give up a food that we like, video games or arguing with our siblings. When we give up something and then really want it, that longing for it will bring us closer to God. What will your fasting be?

Living our Faith: Try this Lent not to give into temptation. When it comes, stop and think of Jesus and pray to him to help you just as Jesus relied on God his father to help him.

### 2023 Men's Conference







## Book of Month: January & February


