



Assailant Suffers Injuries from Fall!

Charles Smith, a store manger for Best Buy in Augusta GA, told police he observed a male customer, later identified as Tyrone Jackson of Augusta, on surveillance cameras putting a laptop computer under his jacket. When confronted the man became irate, knocked down an employee, drew a knife and ran for the door.

Outside were four Marines collecting toys for the Toys for Tots program. Smith said the Marines stopped the man but he stabbed one of the Marines, Cpl. Phillip Duggan in the back; the wound did not appear to be severe.

After Police and an ambulance arrived Cpl. Duggan was transported to the hospital for treatment.

"The subject was also transported to the local hospital with two broken arms, a broken ankle, a broken leg, several missing teeth, possible broken ribs, multiple contusions, assorted lacerations and a broken nose....injuries he sustained when fell off the curb after stabbing the Marine.", according to a Police report.

The Meaning of Advent"

Once again Christmas is very near – one week from this writing! As I sit here tonight, I am wondering how many of you have ever thought of the real meaning of Advent as a Season of the Church.

For the liturgical churches, we are in the Season of Advent. Advent is the beginning of a new church year and the season in which we look and prepare for the return, or the SECOND coming of Christ. Strange that Advent is just before Christmas and gets mixed up in the time of Christmas Carols and the preparation for the Celebration of the birth (FIRST coming) of the Baby Jesus. How is it that Advent is not the Season of preparation for Christmas? Well, in a way, it is. It is a time when we as Christians look toward both Bethlehem and the consummation of God's plan.

To allow Advent to have its fullest dramatic impact, some churches are encouraged to defer Christmas music, decorations, and parties until the 12 days of Christmas (December 24-January 5). The richness of the symbols and themes of Advent must not be obscured by the Christmas preparations. I knew many friends in my youth whose family never sang Christmas Carols or buy and decorate their Christmas tree until Christmas Eve, thereby, giving both Seasons their full benefit.

How does one manage to get through all this with Christmas Carols being played 24/7 from Thanksgiving Day in the shopping malls and on the TV and radio? There has to be a way to honor both and acknowledge that Christ was born in Bethlehem and will come again as we believe.

The first two Sundays in Advent center on the Parousia (the second coming of Jesus), or as the New Testament prefers to call it, his appearing. The Third Sunday in Advent centers on John the Baptist as the herald of Christ, and the Fourth Sunday on the Virgin Mary as the obedient servant chosen to bear God's anointed one. The alternate Gospels for the First Sunday retain the theme of the entry into Jerusalem by Jesus, which was the traditional reading for the beginning of Advent and which understood the entrance on Palm Sunday as a foreshad-owing of the second coming. Many Advent hymns employ that imagery.


I find resolve in a song "The First Light," by the a cappella group GLAD: "Hear the angels as they are singing on the morning of His birth, but how much greater will our song be, when comes again to earth!"

So the bottom line for this retired liturgical pastor, let the Advent Season be filled with the Christmas music with all its glory of a Savior born in a stable in Bethlehem, but let it also be a time of preparation for that great second coming as we sing of a Savior returning to rule the earth in PEACE!

After all is said and done, isn't it our desire to have a life of HOPE (1^{st} candle -purple), PREPARATION (2^{nd} candle-purple), JOY (3^{rd} candle-pink), and LOVE (4^{th} candle-purple) which is depicted on the Advent wreath and then the 5^{th} candle of white is lit on Christmas Day which reminds us that Christ is the Lamb of God, who will come again to earth.
