Some thoughts on sharing the Good News # "Another great light has gone out of this world. And now who will go forth and carry Christ's message?"



In the late 40's, I occasionally heard Dr. Grahams radio ministry, but watching a 1949 televised Crusade his message literally scared the "hell out of me." This man knew what the Bible was saying and I recognized that I too was sinful and unclean even though I had been in church all my life. I needed to begin a repentant life and share the Good News. Dr. Graham's expositions of scriptures are simple yet profound. The following Weekends have been scheduled with one more to be added in Massachusetts in the fall.


