Village of Cohocton

Local Law Numbered 4 of the year 2004

A Local Law entitled "Juvenile Nocturnal Curfew"

Be It enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Cohocton as follows:

- 1. It is declared to be in the public interest of the residents of the Village of Cohocton, New York, to both protect children of immature years and to reduce and/or prevent the ever increasing amount of juvenile nocturnal crime.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of sixteen (16) years to be or remain upon any street or alley or other public place with no legitimate purpose or to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, parks, playgrounds or other public grounds, places, buildings, places of amusement, eating places, vacant lots or any unsupervised places within the Village of Cohocton, New York between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and daylight immediately following unless said minor was accompanied by his parents, guardian or other adult person having the legal care and custody of the minor, or the minor is upon an emergency errand directed by his parents or guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of the minor or where the minor was directly going to or returning home from work or was directly returning home from a meeting, school function or recreational activity.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for the parents, guardian, or for anyone having the legal care and custody of a minor as described above to allow or permit such minor to go or be upon any public street, alley or other public place in the Village of Cohocton between 10:00 P.M. and daylight immediately following as restricted in the preceding section.
- 4. Any law enforcement official is hereby authorized to detain any such minor willfully violating the provisions of this Local Law until the parent, guardian or person having the legal care and custody of said minor shall take him or her into custody; but such law enforcement official shall immediately upon taking custody of the minor child communicate with the parent, guardian or the person having the legal care and custody of said child.
- 5. A violation of this Local Law shall be punishable as a violation. Upon conviction for a violation of this Local Law the Court shall impose a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 for the first offense and for a second and subsequent offense committed within eighteen (18) months the fine shall be not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00. In addition to the fine imposed herein the Court is authorized to impose any other lawful sentence as is prescribed in the Penal Law of the State of New York.
- 6. This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
