

Getting to know our family MEET: Kenny Bork Sunset Village

was born in Macon on April 4, 1949 to Raymond and Alice Bork. We lived in Macon out on PP. My dad worked for farmers in the area, and my mom worked at Banquet Food and the Dairy Queen. At that time the Dairy Queen was a little building right south of the school. I remember Cad taking her to work, and I'd get an ice cream cone. Mom then went to work as a cook at the old Standard Station. It was on the corner of Hwy 63 and Business 36. Mom worked there for 15 years or so. She was famous for her pies and hot rolls. My favorite was her banana cream pie. She could really do it up good with the meringue piled up high. She ended up going to work at the Clarence Factory, and eventually retired from there.

We moved into town, and that's where I lived the rest of the time before I came to live at Loch Haven. I was an only child. I always loved to hunt and fish...even as a kid. My friends and I would hunt squirrels, rabbits, quail, deer. I'd like to have a good rabbit to eat. I miss that!

I always loved animals. We of course had dogs and cats, but I also had a nanny goat. I'd milk her and give it to the cats. My dog, Princess, lived here for several years. Now, my mom brings her out to stay with me three days a week. She's my girl.

I went to school in Macon except for my first year in school where I went to the country school in Anabel. I can still remember all of my teachers' names. In high school my favorite class was Home Ec and my shop class. I made a gun case and a lamp.



I was just a typical teenager of the time. I'd get in trouble with my buddies for smoking behind the school. I liked to go to Howard's Skating Rink although I didn't skate. Never could. But it was close to where I lived, so I was there a lot.

When I turned 21, I got a 1959 Chevy. It wasn't anything fancy, but it did have a musical horn. You'd push a button, and it'd play a tune. It actually played several different tunes!

I worked at Don's Skelly at 63 & Vine. Started my senior year and worked there for six years. There were three other stations at that intersection (DX, Phillips 66, and Imperial). I remember gas being as low as 25 cents a gallon during one of the gas wars.

I had a lot of fun at the station. I remember one time getting in a little trouble when I pulled a prank on Howard Gladhill. He'd stopped in to use the bathroom. I had some fireworks in my trunk (it was July). Keith Maloney and I put smoke bombs under the door and through the open window. Keith got sent home, and I got chewed on all afternoon! The next day, Howard came back and was going to get even. He had a homemade bomb you put on a spark plug that he put in my car. We saw him do it, so Keith got his attention and I got the bomb and put it in the back of Howard's truck. When he drove out of the station....Kaboom!! His truck died and a semi was coming honking his horn. He got it going, but about had a nervous breakdown!!! Everyone had a good laugh.

I eventually went to work for the Norfolk and Western Railroad on the tie gang. We worked all over the place. I got hurt working, so I had to quit. I went to work for myself hauling dirt and gravel, building driveways and all kinds of odd jobs. You name it, and I did it.

I came to live at Loch Haven in 2004. I still go to McDonalds twice a week (the OATS bus picks me up). I go to as many activities as I can. I like to eat, and there's some good cooks here. My favorites are Penny Hicks, Jennifer Stivers, and Sharon Freeman. You haven't tasted a steak until Sharon cooks you one. Mostly I like to aggravate the Dietary Staff, especially Di Hicks. I think they like to aggravate me back!

When we have a new resident come into our home and they have insurance, whether it is a Medicare Supplement or a Long Term Care policy, I call their company to see what their benefits are and try to discuss that with the resident or a family member. If there are claim forms to be filled out, I get those and fill them out, get the resident's signature (or the designated family member) and fax them in for them. I bill their insurance company each month, and if the resident desires apply any payments to their account. If the resident or family member has any questions or concerns, I try my best to answer them immediately. If I can't, I call their company and find out the information for them. 

A Note from Corporate Compliance Officer BJ Roberts

Ethical business practices are everyone's concern. Every business enterprise in our country has opportunities for the misuse of information or money. The fraud investigation units of many corporations are uncovering questionable internal and external practices. Like every other industry, health care has regulatory obligations regarding the reporting and investigating of fraud and abuse. From the newest employee to the concerned community citizen, we all have an obligation to report business practices that are unethical or illegal. During the orientation process, our new employees receive training on the process of complying with state and federal government regulations; part of that process is the steps to reporting abuses of business and care practices within the facility. The Loch Haven report line, 660-395-7979, is available for those outside the facility to use to make reports. Once the report of an infraction has been received, an internal investigation will take place. The law is specific in regards to the investigation and the steps to be taken if ethical violations are discovered. Loch Haven's Corporate Compliance committee meets monthly to discuss and review our internal practices and make sure we maintain our standards of practice.

Cooking up a Storm!

Broccoli, Bacon and Raisin Salad

 bunch broccoli, washed, drained and broken into florets
 cup hulled sunflower seeds
 cup raisins
 cup chopped, red onion
 pound bacon, fried crisp and crumbled

Dressing

3/4 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing1/2 cup granulated sugar2 tablespoons white vinegar

Fry the bacon and crumble. Mix all ingredients, except the dressing, in a

bowl. In a separate bowl, mix dressing ingredients and pour over salad ingredients. Toss until everything is coated. Chill until ready to serve.



Oreo Cheesecake Cookies

1 cup butter, room temperature

- 8 oz cream cheese, room temperature
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 2 cups all-purpose flour

3 cups Oreo cookie crumbles, divided Preheat oven to 375. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Ceam together butter and cream cheese until well combined. Add in sugar and vanilla and mix well. Add in flour one cup at a time until it is just combined. Stir in 1 cup of Oreo crumbles into the cookie mix. Pour remaining Oreo crumbles into a bowl. Roll cookie dough into 1.5" balls

then roll into the cookie crumbles, making sure to coat each ball thoroughly (this will help hold the cookie together as it cooks). Place cookies 1-2" apart on baking sheet. Bake on center rack for 14-15 minutes or until the bottom just starts to brown. Allow to cool on the baking sheet for a few minutes before removing to a rack to cool completely



- 4 cups frozen cubed hash brown potatoes
- 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 1/4 pound smoked sausage, halved lengthwise and cut into 1/4-inch slices
- 3 slices process American cheese

In a large skillet, cook potatoes and pepper in oil over medium heat until potatoes are golden brown. Stir in sausage; heat through. Remove from heat; top with cheese. Cover and let stand for 5 minutes or until cheese is melted.
