Ready to study: Ivy Tech good option for busy students

EDFORD — Buying school
supplies was a little weird for
Jesse Craig.

Craig just started taking classes at Ivy Tech, so going back into the classroom was a daunting task. It's been "forever" since he's been a student. "Since the dinosaurs roamed the Earth," he said.

Working a full-time job and taking five courses means Craig will be busy, so having courses in Bedford makes it possible for him to be a student and pursue a degree in health and human services. Craig hopes to be a substance abuse counselor.

Aug. 27 was only the second day for this interpersonal communications class to meet, and first-day jitters were still present. "I'm still nervous," Craig said.

Being a working student isn't easy, but Craig seems up for the challenge. "It keeps me motivated and it keeps me out of trouble," he said.

Ivy Tech's class offerings in Bedford is just the answer for many students. Many need to balance school with other responsibilities. For some, the classes are an affordable choice for furthering



their education. For others, Ivy Tech is just the right size.

Across the room, Catlin Caudill is settled in and ready for class. She started her school career at Vincennes University with the hopes of studying occupational therapy before changing to nursing. But this self-proclaimed country girl didn't

like living in the city. Family is important, too, so she made the decision to transfer to Ivy Tech.

Prior to class, Caudill talks about the upcoming lesson with instructor Paula Hartman and talks about how much she enjoyed chapter two of the textbook.

With a smaller class size, Caudill seems comfortable and doesn't feel anxious. She feels teachers are more hands-on with their lessons, and the pace feels right.

"I learn better," Caudill said.

Before class, Hartman asks students to write their name on the whiteboard along with what they'd like to discuss from chapter two — the assigned reading for the class.

Hartman is used to teaching the material in a fourth of the time as her previous assignment

"And I'm really excited because I think the 16-week has a slower pace and is going to allow us much more group interaction and talking and sharing and practicing some of the skills that we just didn't have time to do when you were in the eight-week class," Hartman said.

Her only concern about a 16-week class that


