

Liwienski, Casimir

Casimir L. Liwienski, 74, of Caseville, died Monday evening, November 10, 2003, at Scheurer Hospital following a severe heart attack. He was born on July 28, 1929 in Detroit to the late Martin and Ursula (Misiak) Liwienski. After Cass graduated from North Eastern High School, he joined the Army and served during the Korean War. Upon his return home, he worked with the U.S. Postal Service, retiring as a dispatcher in 1984 with 32 years of service. Shortly after retiring, he moved to Caseville where he and his family had been coming since the early 1960s. Cass was a member of St. Roch Catholic Church of Caseville, the Caseville Eagles Club and the Frank Horetski American Legion Post No. 499 in Port Austin. He was very talented with stained glass, making windows, lamp shades and ornaments. He also enjoyed gardening, golf, bowling and all of the Detroit sports teams. Surviving are his brother, Ted Liwienski, of Caseville; sister, Sophia Szajna and her husband, Edmund, of Brooksville, Florida, and many nieces and nephews, who all thought of him as a second father. He was preceded in death by a sister, Wanda Leiman; and a brother, Henry Liwienski. A funeral mass will be conducted at 11 a.m. on Friday, November 14, 2003, at St. Roch Catholic Church, Caseville. The Rev. Fr. Kenneth Yaroch, pastor, will officiate with burial in the church cemetery. An Eagles service will be conducted at 6:30 p.m. and a parish scripture service at 7 p.m. on Thursday at the Champagne Funeral Chapel, Caseville.
