

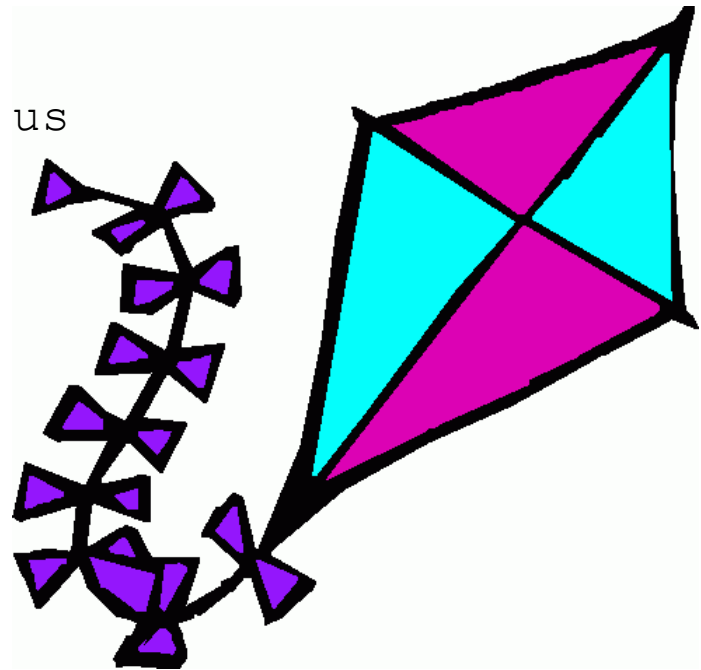
Poem of the Month Club: March
