FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ.

Just recently following the Christmas vacation, I resumed my weekly visits with our preschool children. I consider it both a privilege and a joy to spend even a brief time with them. They're so energetic, so eager and receptive.

For the first of our get-togethers during this season of Epiphany, I shared the story of the Three Wise Men and their visit to bring gifts to the Baby Jesus—and how special He is. Then I taught them a simple song with movements about how each of them was special, each of them was a gift just as Jesus was a gift to us.

Finally, I opened it up for questions and discussion. All the hands shot up in an instant: "Me, me, I have a question!" they shouted. Such enthusiasm! One little boy asked, "What makes Jesus so special?" He'd cut right to the heart of things as only a child can. "Because He's God's Son," I replied, quoting directly from our pre-school Bible.

"Why did God make the world?" this time asked by a shy little girl. Before I could answer, another girl looked up at me with a demure smile: "Because He was lonely," she said.

For just a moment, I thought about what my seminary professors had taught me—that God as Trinity enjoyed the fellowship of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit there in heaven; He had no lack of anything. Of course, that's not what I told this bright young lady. "Yes," I responded, "God was lonely, so He created a world where He could love all the people, animals, plants and all the other beautiful and good things He had made."

Closing with a brief prayer, I emphasized how much God loves each one of them along with their teachers, parents, and brothers and sisters. Considering the fact that many of these youngsters come from unchurched families, I think you can understand why I make my time with them such a priority; because, if the Holy Spirit is alive and active in their young lives so naturally and unaffectedly, then it is true, as Jesus has said, that it is to such as these that the Kingdom of heaven belongs (Lk. 18:14-17).

Arndt's Lutheran Church in Easton





Hunger is a real problem in our country and our area of Pennsylvania is no different. Last year we started a reverse Advent food drive where congregants collected food items each day during Advent, culminating with delivery to our local food bank. It was such a success that we decided to expand it to the community. Volunteers will collect, sort, and deliver food items to the pantry right after Christmas when the need is the greatest. This year's food drive was very successful as we collected 983 lbs. of food valued at \$1671 for the ProJeCt Easton Food Pantry in Easton, PA. Approximately 43 families from Arndt's and people outside the community participated in the project. A local moving company donated a truck and manpower for the delivery. We hope to make this project an annual event of providing for those in need.
