## **CHIHUAHUAN DESERT WILDLIFE RESCUE**


A nonprofit organization which exists to help rehabilitators in the care of injured or orphaned wildlife and also works to educate the public about wildlife conservation issues.



# AT FEATHER LAKE


Last year at this time, Feather Lake was 6 months into a dry period that ultimately lasted 7.5 months. The stress on the vegetation was severe, and we lost many cottonwoods and willows. This year, the picture has been brighter, wetter and greener. Since late March, Feather Lake has received enough irrigation water and storm runoff to keep the basin consistently flooded. Following storms in mid May, the depth at the inlet reached almost 3.5 feet.

The riparian vegetation at our sanctuary has responded favorably. It looks better than it has in several years. Gambel's Quail, Green Herons, Swainson's Hawks and more are all taking advantage.

Our public-use schedule this past year can only be described as erratic, dictated by cycles of drying and flooding. After water returned in late March, we opened again to the public in April and stayed open through the end of May. Sincere thanks go to Jane Fowler, Mike Gaglio, Joe and Inga Groff, Flora Pittard, Roxanne Schroeder, Ursula Sherrill and John Sproul for staffing our sanctuary during this period. The lake is now closed until September.

Closed, that is, with one exception. Will Feather Lake stay consistently flooded during spring and summer this year for the first time since 2002? You can find out by taking part in our next workday. It takes place **Sat., August 4**,

starting at 8 a.m. Come on down and pull a few tumbleweeds. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

## **GLENWOOD - LUNA**

The weekend of 23/24 June we will meet on Sat at 11 AM in the parking lot of the Ranger Station, located at the south end of Glenwood NM. This will be a great weekend in a part of the Gila National Forest that many of you have not birded. For camping we'll go to Pueblo Park campground, where sightings of Mountain Chickadee's, Steller's Jays and Cassin's Kingbird are possible. The last trip, two years ago, we had a Tassel-eared Squirrel that visited us regularly, and along the road going in, a young Northern Goshawk was sitting in a tree.

We will also visit the <u>Luna-Reserve</u> area with a good chance of *Lewis's Woodpecker* and maybe *Pinyon Jay*, also some Prairie Dogs are in the area. We'll then go over to <u>Luna Lake</u> for lunch, here we could have good views of Mergansers, and a possible *Bald Eagle*. In <u>Glenwood</u> a stop at the fish hatchery could yield **Summer Tanager** and some *flycatchers*. From there it's out to the <u>Catwalk</u> where the *American Dipper* nests.

On the return trip to El Paso we'll stop at Mangas Springs which is often good for the Common Black-Hawk and Lincoln's Sparrow. If you want to sleep inside there are motels in Glenwood and Reserve. A number of <u>Mississippi Kites</u> have nests within the area and the young probably will not have fledged yet. # WATER CANYON July 21 - 22

Then up into the Cibola Nat. Forest hoping to find Warbling Vireo, Black-Throated Gray Warbler. We have had Red-faced Warbler a few times in the past. A side trip into the Magdalena area for Western Bluebirds and maybe Pinyon Jays. Also a stop at the Very Large Array Radio Telescope. Camping in the Canyon or Motels in Socorro.
