PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE APRIL 2019



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MINUTES OF HBPOA MEETING, COAST GUARD BUILDING March 7, 2019 @ 7:00 PM

Kathy Frase, President, called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM and invited all present to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance. She welcomed all present, including three new members: Suzie Oyler and Bill and Patty Roberts.

Our president then called for a motion to accept the February Minutes as published in the Beachcomber. Cal Holland so moved, motion was seconded by Sarge Dendy and passed.

In the absence of Bud Frase, Treasurer, Kathy gave the Treasurer's Report as follows:

Balance on Hand as of 2/01/19 was \$23,809.61 and as of 2/28/19 was \$23,626.78. The report will be filed for audit.

OLD BUSINESS:

Renewal HBPOA membership for 2019...... Kathy reminded us that the deadline to renew ones membership was 2/28/19 although certainly no one will be turned away. She also pointed out that as of tonight's meeting our count was 162 members and, apparently tonight 16 more have been added. We have exceeded the count of 168 at the end of last year already and the year is still young!

PayPal.....In an effort to make joining our association even easier, we are having PayPal set up so that dues can be paid online. This should be very helpful to those who perhaps travel a lot or who are snowbirds and hopefully will help our numbers to grow even more.

showed many examples in his presentation of situations where this vast neighborhood watch has prevented a crime from occurring. It is also helpful to know that anonymity is always maintained. Another very efficient aspect of the Neighbors App is the ability for individual portals for law enforcement in any given community, allowing the officer responsible for policing a specific community to access a zone specifically for that community instead of having to scroll through feeds from other communities.

By doing these presentations, Detective Galarza is able to give out Ring cameras and the department is also able to donate cameras to people who have been victimized multiple times and victims of domestic violence and will even install cameras for those who are not able to do it themselves. All of this is an effort to interact with communities and promote community policing. At the end of Detective Galarza's very informative presentation, two Ring cameras were raffled off and were won by our new member, Bill Roberts and by Jesse Manno!

Steve Barton showed us on a map the area owned by Charles Sasser that is in question and also pointed out that the Port Authority, BOCC, and many residents of Hernando Beach are very much against this project which could have a very negative impact on our community. One huge possible impact if this project were to go through could be flooding of homes on Flamingo Blvd. during storm surges or even just high tides. The BOCC website listed at least 7 negative impacts that could occur. 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


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

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BOATING SAFETY ID CARD REQUIREMENT

For anyone born on or after January 1, 1988, who will be operating a boat in Florida waters with an engine of ten (10) horsepower or more, the law requires them to complete an <u>approved boating safety course</u> and obtain a Florida Boating Safety ID Card. This card is not a boating license, it is a certification that the person named on the card has successfully completed the required boating safety course. The card does not expire. You can find information on how to obtain the card below.

How to get a Florida Boating Safety ID Card
After you have successfully completed an approved Florida boating safety course, please follow these steps:

Check with your course provider or instructor to see if they will automatically send a request to FWC to issue a card. Many online course providers, and some classroom providers, automatically submit a ID card request to FWC for all of their

students who successfully complete an approved Florida course. (Because the course providers are not affiliated with FWC, they must send student information to FWC in order for a card to be issued.) If your course provider automatically sends a request to FWC for your card, you should receive that card within 2 to 3 weeks.

If the course provider or instructor is not going to submit the information for FWC to issue a card, you can do so using the course completion certificate you receive from the provider after you have passed the course. For online courses, make sure you can print a copy of this certificate from their website or that you can get an electronic copy. If you take a classroom course, make sure your instructor provides proof of completion. This proof can be a card or certificate, but in order for FWC to issue a boating safety ID card, the proof of completion must have the following information:

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
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
