

JUNIOR AIR RIFLE MATCH RESULTS

The 2018 AMU Army Air Rifle Sectional match, both the Sporter and Precision competition matches, were held at our new Air Rifle range on Oct 20th. There were 20 competitors in all, with 3 relays held throughout the day. This was a nice turnout. Competitors from all over the Puget Sound Area participated. The Sporter shot a 3-position match consisting of 20 shots in prone, 20 shots in offhand, and 20 shots in kneeling. The Precision match was 60 shots all in offhand. The distance is 10 meters.

This is a qualifier match which all the scores from all the sectionals across the country are combined. After Dec 18, the top individuals and top teams are invited to the AMU (Army Marksmanship Unit) in Ft Benning, GA during early 2019 to compete in the National Finals. The results for both Precision and Sporter can be seen here. Doug Shellenberger was our Match Director, Jim Cellini ran the Orion and May Patajo was the Range Officer.

Our hunter sight-in program has come to an end for the season. It was a big success this year. Thanks to all the club members that came out to help.

We hosted the All Army airgun match last Saturday with 20 shooters coming in from all over the state to compete. This was a qualifier match for an invite to compete at Ft. Benning. The match was scored using the Orion decimal scoring system, a very precise, real time way to score targets. Read more details about the match in May Patajo's article.

I recently took a load of brass turned in by shooters to the recycler. We took 495 pounds total, which brought in \$808 to the junior program. The last time we did this was in January, so it really adds up quick. We also sell a lot of the usable brass to reloaders, another income that supports the junior program. Thanks to all shooters who deposit their spent brass in the red containers on the range. We used the money to purchase 2 replacement air cylinders for the air rifles and 4 new shooting coats.

We have openings Tuesday nights for juniors who would like to give smallbore and airgun shooting a try. We recently had a couple of 10 year-olds come out to give it a try. That is a bit on the young side since the rifles can be a bit cumbersome for the smaller kids, but it gives them an introduction to shooting that hopefully they will stay with them as they grow. Dave Farrow rented a backhoe for use on the IPSC range electrical/safety area project. While we had it, we dug 4 holes behind the rifle range firing line, filling them with rock to improve the drainage on the firing line area.

We recently replaced the tire on the left gong on the rifle range. The tire had incurred so many bullet strikes thru the years of being shot, it had almost disintegrated. The gong was also broken, so it was replaced at the same time.

Right now, we have no firewood for sale. We have identified a few trees that need to come down, but we haven't been able to coordinate with our tree guy to have them cut down.

We were finally able to find a bucket lift for rent, so we had it delivered and put it to good use. We removed an electrical wire running along the road to the 200-yard pits and patched the baffle bullet strikes (there were a LOT of them) on the rifle range. We have plans on giving Paul a much-needed pressure washing if time permits.
