

Emerson Colaw tells about doing some work with his church's non-resident membership list. He wrote a letter to one family that had been very active in his church. A letter came back with the following reply:

Mr. Colaw, we now live near a university campus and we go every Sunday to the chapel service there. They have unusually fine music...they have nationally known preachers every Sunday morning...the children are being taught in church school by seminary students. But best of all there is no membership, no pledging, and no committees asking us to work. So, if you don't mind, we'll just leave our membership at Hydu Park and continue to enjoy what we have here.

Wow, right?! Well, this particular church experience may have been as great as this person commented – for a spectator, that is! What about participation? Participation – living out the Christian life – is what God calls every Christian to do. Church membership underscores this. Those who become members pledge the following to faithfully participate in the ministries of the church by ones prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Membership is a public confession of ones' faith (Jesus said, "Whosoever therefore shall confess me before people, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven" - Matthew 10:32) and a powerful reminder that we are accountable to God and to one another ("Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the Day approaching" - Hebrews 10:25). It is good for those who have given their membership vows to review this from time to time as a sort of gauge to where they are in their Christian walk. It is also good for those who have not yet given their membership vows to consider a deeper commitment to Christ through church membership.

Beginning February 17th, adults and kids will begin to meet to discover the meaning of membership. Current members are welcome as a refresher course. Perspective members are welcome to come and learn.

We hope you were able to be with us in December for the Christmas Cantata, *Noel! Emmanuel!*. Almost fifty people participated in some manner - adult and child singers, ringers, soloists, trios, percussion, guitar, narrators. We are grateful for the folks who came in from other music services and from the congregation to assist us.

Before the Chancel Choir came into the sanctuary on Cantata Sunday, we talked about how it is really the text that bears the most importance in choral music. The tune is really the vehicle on which the real message of Bethlehem was to be delivered. And though we hope for every detail, the truth is that we miss things. But after all of the work in rehearsals, if we allow the words to reside in our hearts (remember the scripture of Mary pondering things in her heart?), then we step aside and the blessings of the Holy Spirit descend. We are not perfect by any stretch. We do however hope for the very best that our gifts allow. After all, we offer them back to the Giver Himself. We said once that we really present our musical abilities to God first - you who are gathered in the congregation really are eavesdropping on our worship at the throne of the Most High.

The same week of Cantata, the ringers and singers traveled to ERCC for the 14th annual Christmas Candlelight service. It was as we all knew it was going to be. The Rev. Dr. Basil Hensley, chaplain at the Center, and pastor emeritus of FUMC, led the worship with residents, who are family to him in the most poignant, strong ways. We were happy to be there with him, and with residents, families and staff. In those moments of worship together, the spirit of Advent, the true blessing of Christmas, was present for us all.

Several years ago, we sang an anthem called "The Work of Christmas". The music is written by Dan Forrest, with a powerful text by Howard Thurman, a theologian and writer who lived for the first 80 years of the 20th century.

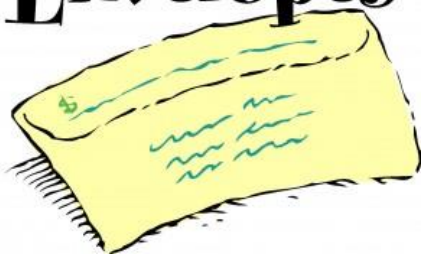
When the song of the angels is stilled,
