# The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

We begin studying the gospel of Luke. Luke seeks to tell Jesus's followers, you and me, and orderly account of the truth concerning Jesus. 

Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, 

just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, 

too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, 

so that you may know

the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed. Luke 1:1-4.

Luke later includes one phrase that changes the understanding of what occurred in Jesus's birth. <sup>7</sup>And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. Luke 2:7.

<u>wrapped him in bands of cloth</u> Mary does not have a soft, cuddly blanket for her baby, she only has scraps of cloth, to piece together to swaddle her baby boy.

<u>laid him in a manger</u> Mary does not have a crocheted, knitted, or embroidered bassinet. Mary borrows a feed trough to place her baby.

because there was no place for them in the inn: These few words adds another dimension to the birth of Christ. The phrase adds another character to the Christmas play. Ultimately, this verse gives hope to the world. Mary and Joseph do not give up. Possibly this "no room" might give them more determinization. Mary and Joseph don't allow a full hotel to keep the coming of Christ to be delayed. Mary and Joseph experience what rejection looked like. Mary and Joseph persisted and found shelter. Jesus is born in the most perfect of humbled space. Most likely this was not the shelter they imagined, but it was shelter. No human assistance for Mary (and Joseph) with the birthing process. It was only God and God's creation who were able to witness the birth of the Christ child. God was with Mary and Joseph as their lives were changing forever.

God's story for creation and humankind continued. God keeps his promises. <sup>25</sup>Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. <sup>26</sup>It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. <sup>27</sup>Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, <sup>28</sup>Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

<sup>29</sup>"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;

<sup>30</sup> for my eyes have seen your salvation,

<sup>31</sup>which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

<sup>32</sup>a light for revelation to the Gentiles

and for glory to your people Israel." Luke 2: 25-32

This beautiful story about Simeon is read every year the first Sunday after Christmas. Simeon was promised by God that Simeon would not see death until Simeon saw Jesus. This story reveals a reminder of the presence of the Holy Spirit active even before the birth of Christ. This story reminded Simeon that God keeps his word. This story reveals to us today the promises God makes with God's people. God continues God's promises and presence with us, his children.

I will schedule a meeting for those interested in January and we will discuss the details. There are only two requirements: You must purchase your child's book and students must practice. (Pretty simple?) I will schedule these classes on various afternoons according to both family schedules and mine. The classes will be 30 minutes each.

For the coming months, I would like to get some feedback from the congregation concerning the music program and what we have been doing. What do you like, what would you like to see, do you have particular hymns/songs you would like sung or played? Feedback is healthy and should be used in a positive manner, so please include your name with your suggestions/information. ### **REPORTS:**

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. We welcome our new seminarian, Laura Henrickson. Ten new members will join Mt. Hermon soon.

### Team Reports/Recommendations:

Outreach: Written report received from October meeting. Mt. Hermon was contacted by Wood Elementary asking if we would provide 25 weekend snack backpacks for their students in need. 





Angel Tree Ministry - Each year we help children in the community have a brighter Christmas by buying gifts for them. The children are identified by the local schools, and we gather a list of their needs and wants and place them on ornaments. The Angel Tree is up in the Education Building outside of the Church Office. Please make plans to sponsor a child this Christmas. We will also include parents of the children on the tree with some of their needs. We need the wrapped gifts at the church by Monday, Dec. 13.

Heart to Home Ministry – Wood Elementary reached out to Mt. Hermon for help with their weekend snack program. This is a program where the identified children in need are provided food for the weekend. We provide 25 bags each week containing child friendly items such as: Mac & Cheese Cups, Cup-a-Soup, Oatmeal, Yogurt Pouches, Cheese Crackers, Cereal, Granola Bars, etc. We try to make sure we are giving them at least two breakfast foods, four lunch/supper foods and two snacks. The bags are delivered to the school to distribute to their students in need. Mt. Hermon has just started participating in this ministry and we are excited to be involved helping God feed His children. We are calling it – Heart to Home Ministry- from the heart Mt. Hermon to the homes of children. So far, God has provided funding for this ministry from several sources: members, State Farm, Thrivent Financial and South State Bank. In addition to the funds, we have received so far, First Citizens Mortgage Department sponsored a child-friendly food drive. They donated a carload of child-friendly food. We are excited to be involved in this Outreach ministry and appreciate Melanie Jackson's willingness to coordinate it.
