## **MINUTES**

Call to Order 7:00 PM, Pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call.

Others in attendance: Approximately 40 members of the community.

1. Public Comments: Taw Richardson expressed concerns for the Town to pass Resolution 2021-06 supporting the Carbon Dividend Act. Carmen Grainger said that she researched tips on how residents can reduce Carbon Emissions and asked the guest speaker, Linda Smith, questions.

Guest Speakers: Newly elected Mayor for the Village of Tequesta, Frank D'Ambra, came and spoke to the residents and Commissioners. Mayor D'Ambra thanked Vice Mayor Block and Mayor Comerford for inviting him to the meeting, and he is looking forward to maintaining a close working relationship with our Town.

Newly elected County Commissioner for District 1, Maria Marino, came and introduced herself to our residents and thanked the Commissioners for their hard work and Town Administrator Kevin Lucas, whom she recently met at a Manager's meeting.

Volunteer for the Carbon Dividend Act, Linda Smith, presented residents and Commissioners with a detailed explanation regarding the Resolution showing support in urging the United States Congress to take prompt action addressing the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend act of 2019. Linda answered questions from the residents and Commissioners.

Motion: Vice Mayor Block made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Second: Commissioner Busto seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.

3. Commission/Staff Reports

- a. Town Administrator- No Report
- b. Chief of Police- Absent.
- c. Code Enforcement- Mayor Comerford
- d. Town Attorney -No Report
- e. Commissioners: Commissioner Keim said she is working with Jupiter Island on the sign issues.
- f. Vice-Mayor: Vice Mayor Block reported that progress is being made with the JILONA property as far as enforcement and improvement go. The Vice Mayor said that with the help of Congressman Brian Mast, one million dollars had been released to improve the infrastructure and shoreline.
- g. Mayor Comerford- The Mayor announced that he is disappointed that the street sign project is stalled after learning the Town cannot piggyback off of another contract as initially planned. The Town has prepared a twenty-two-page Request For Proposal (RFP) and will award the contract in June. Mayor Comerford also announced that the Town will be receiving approximately \$190,360.66 in funds from the American Rescue Plan Act, which will be discussed in the near future. Mayor Comerford, the money has no restrictions other than not being allowed to lower taxes directly. The money is due to arrive in May of 2021 and March of 2022. The Mayor was also happy to announce that we were one of only fifteen Municipalities Countrywide selected to receive a \$10,800.00 grant to pay for the LEED application fees. The money will be used in two parts, \$2800.00 to file the application and then an additional \$8000.00. Mayor Comerford commended Bill Whiteford for his leadership in writing the grant.
- 4. Resolution: 2021-05 to appoint Elizabeth (Liz) Hailman to Social Committee.

Mayor Comerford explained that Mrs. Hailman's name was unintentionally omitted from the appointment to the Social Committee Board at the last month's Organizational Meeting. Mayor Comerford apologized on behalf of the Town and thanked Mrs. Hailman for volunteering.

Motion: Commissioner Busto made a motion to approve the Resolution. Second: Vice Mayor Block seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.

5. Garden Club Presentation- Sharon Seagren presented the Garden Club's vision for the renovation of Como Park. Mrs. Seagren outlined the Funding, Vendors, Plants, and Project timeline. There was a brief discussion between residents and Commissioners. Mrs. Seagren answered the audience and Commissioner's questions, Kathie Comerford commented on the trees planted at the park and how she and others would like them to remain there. The project will have an estimated \$50,000.00 cost, and they will seek private donations and some funding from the Town. The PowerPoint presentation will be placed on the Town's website. The Garden Club will report back to the Commission with their progress, and the Town will consider a dollar amount to contribute. After a more detailed presentation by the Garden Club and an update of Fundraising.

Motion: Commissioner Lisa Hines made a motion to support the project. Second: Commissioner Keim seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.

6. Vote: First Reading Ordinance 01-2021 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF JUPITER INLET COLONY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 21-WATERWAYS, ARTICLE II. 7. Vote: First Reading Ordinance 02- 2021 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF JUPITER INLET COLONY, FLORIDA AMENDING APPENDIX A-ZONING CODE, ARTICLE I. GENERAL PROVISIONS, BY AMENDING SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS AND RULES OF CONSTRUCTION IN ORDER TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF FLOOR AREA; BY AMENDING SECTION 3. AUTHORITY. TO REPEAL SAID SECTION IN ITS ENTIRETY AND BY ADOPTING A NEW SECTION 3. AUTHORITY. 9. Vote: Resolution: 2021-06 Urging the United States Congress to Enact the Carbon Dividend Act of 2019.
