

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR

The Lord has ears for everyone's prayers, but the reading from



Exodus emphasizes God's attentiveness to the pleas of those most in need. The Lord surely hears the cry of the wronged widow and orphan, the alien and the debtor. They are some of the most disadvantaged and vulnerable in society, then and now. The Chosen People had recently lived in subjection in Egypt. They definitely should be able to empathize with those who suffer a similar sort of plight now, those who are dependent on the mercy and

goodness of others.

"You are once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt," the Lord said to the Israelites (Exodus 22:20). We may be aliens ourselves in the country in which we live, or perhaps we were once. Perhaps we have never had the experience of calling a new country home, but probably our parents, grandparents, or greatgrandparents did. Very few of us do not have an ancestor who was once an alien here. Therefore, even if we were never aliens ourselves, a line can be drawn to our forebears who were.

Jesus' response to the lawyer echoes Jewish thought in the rabbinical circles of the time, so in that sense he has passed the test. Significantly, he says that "the second (commandment) is like

it" (Matthew 22:39). The two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor, are interrelated. Since we are all made in the image of God, and since we are



called to love God with our whole being, loving our neighborand ourselves - is loving God.

In what ways am I a model for other believers, as the Thessalonians were? What can I do to model the greatest commandments to others?



You, Our Lady of New York, know what we need.


We are certain that you will provide, so that, as you did at Cana of Galilee, joy and feasting might return after this
