


From the President—Sally Steele

It's the day after "Super Tuesday" and the results are in! Some of us will like the outcome, some will not, some don't really know. Some of us want aggressive change, some want stronger







Introducing Prop 50, California's Lone June Statewide Ballot Measure Ben Adler (Capital Public Radio)

The Secretary of State's office has assigned a ballot number to the only statewide measure in California's June primary election. Proposition 50 would allow either house of the state legislature to suspend members — with or without pay — by a two-thirds vote.

It comes in response to the cases of three state senators who faced legal troubles in 2014. Two of them were indicted facing various corruption charges. A third was convicted of perjury and voter fraud for lying about whether he lived inside his state Senate district or not.

The Senate voted to suspend the three Democratic lawmakers that year even though the California constitution only explicitly allows for the expulsion of a lawmaker. The constitution does not currently allow a lawmaker to be stripped of salary and benefits, so the Legislature placed Proposition 50 on the June 2016 ballot to ask voters for the power to suspend their members and dock paychecks.

White House Awards Navy SEAL Medal of Honor



Americanism President Barack Obama awarded the nation's highest military honor Monday to a Navy SEAL who participated in a daring 2012 raid that rescued an American hostage in Afghanistan. Byers, who is a member of SEAL Team 6, received the nation's highest military recognition Monday morning in a ceremony at the White House.

The Senior Chief Special Warfare Operator was recognized for his role in the Dec. 8, 2012 rescue of Dr. Dilip Joseph, who was abducted along with his driver and Afghan interpreter.

According to the Associated Press, Byers flung himself on top of Joseph and shielded him from gunfire. He also grabbed a man who was guarding the hostage and pinned him against a wall until another SEAL was able to shoot the guard.

Obama said during a ceremony at the White House that Byers is the "consummate, quiet professional" who would rather be elsewhere, perhaps holding his breath under dark, frigid water. "Today's ceremony is truly unique, a rare opportunity for the American people to get a glimpse of a special breed of warrior who so often serves in the shadows," Obama said, calling the ceremony perhaps the largest gather of special-operations members in the history of the White House
