The Hatton Half: Perfect Times to Pray

Prayer is something which is important to the Christian life. In the hymnal, there is song entitled "Hear Me When I Call." The song was written by Tillit S. Teddlie, who did much hymn writing in his life. The origins of this hymn come directly out of the fourth Psalm. Apparently, brother Teddlie was struggling with a crisis of some kind later in life, which led to his writing this hymn. It is in this song that one can find different times to pray.

First, a perfect time to pray is when we are in weakness. It is often in weakness that we find ourselves in a state of vulnerability. Often, when someone is vulnerable, a state of fear may arise. The Lord did not intend for us to possess a spirit of fear, but one of a sound mind (2 Tim. 1:7). The Lord does not want us to be fearful every minute we live.

Second, a perfect time to pray is when transgression arises in one's life. Of course, people of an accountable age know what sin is (1 John 3:4). If someone courses through life without confessing the sins committed, that person's prayers will not be heard (Psa. 66:18). If an individual decided to keep on sinning without confession, that person is committing a sin unto death (1 John 5:16-17). As long as there is time on the earth, time is allowed for confession.

It is a very comforting thought to know that any time we need our Lord, He is there for us. The promise is given by the Hebrews writer "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Heb. 13:5-6). Let us remember this promise and always know that the Lord will hear us when we call.
