Business Licenses

The Town of Preeceville would like to remind everyone that to conduct business within the Town of Preeceville, any person who is a contractor, home based business operator, petty trade business operator or a transit trader must obtain an annual business license. All business licenses expired on December 31st, 2022 and must be renewed to be valid for the 2023 year.

Eco Centre Open

Elm Tree Pruning Ban

Once again, the Elm Tree Pruning Ban is in effect from April 1st through to August 31st, as it is each year to prevent the spread of Dutch Elm disease. Got Bats?

Who we are:

We are biologists studying the ecology and health of Prairie bats. We work at the University of Winnipeg and University of Regina. Check us out at <http://www.willisbatlab.org>

Why care about bats:

Bats eat huge numbers of insects, providing pest control services to forests, crops, and people. In the US it is estimated bats save farmers upwards of \$53 billion a year by eating insect pests.

Our research:

We are trying to understand connections between summer breeding sites in Saskatchewan and winter hibernating sites in Manitoba. This can give us insight into bat movements, habitat use, and disease flow.

How you can help:

We are looking for study sites across eastern Saskatchewan in 2023 and 2024. In summer, colonies of mother bats and their pups live together in trees, bat houses, and other human-made structures. If you have a bat colony on your property, we want to hear about it!


