By the time you read this, the Orange Post 132 Amateur Radio Club has become a reality as an official entity of the Post. The purpose of the club is shown in the Articles of Organization:

The Club is a non-commercial association of persons – military veterans and Legionnaires - interested in Amateur Radio, organized for the promotion of interest in Amateur Radio communication and experimentation and education, for the establishment of emergency communications in the event of disasters or other emergencies, for the advancement of the radio art and the public welfare, for the representation of the radio amateur in legislative matters, and for the maintenance of collegiality and a high standard of conduct.

Club membership is open to anyone who is: a member in good standing with the American Legion; of good moral character; who have an interest in amateur radio and/or electronics; have an interest in the aims of the club; and be willing to voluntarily respond to and assist during declarations of emergencies or disasters.

Classes will be offered to provide training and testing for anyone interested in becoming an FCC licensed amateur radio operator. These classes will include the entry level Technician Class as well as upgrade classes for the General and Extra Class Amateur licenses.

We will be a local EOC (Emergency Operations Center) to assist government agencies in times of natural disasters or other emergencies. We will provide communication services as well as provide temporary food/housing as we are able.

Currently, we will be operating our club station out of a box, to be set up when needed. Going forward, a room will be constructed in a corner of the third floor meeting area and antenna structures will be erected outside and around the property as needed and in compliance with regulations pertaining to our status as an historical landmark.

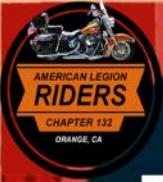
