Hope to see everyone at the August luncheon. Just remember to RSVP! ❖



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
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
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
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
2011 SAABE 7th Annual Picnic/Phil Anderson Memorial

On August 31st, we will tour the Chase Center - Oak Park Building (1020 NE Loop 410). Here, you will find new BAC cooling towers with the condensate water being used to water the landscape. And, sand filters are used to clean the tower water, thereby saving money on chemicals and cleaning. There are also new energy efficient lighting fixtures and many other improvements that could possibly be applied in your building. We will gather at 11:30 a.m. in the lobby of the building, take a tour of the building and then eat lunch. (Please note that SAABE is not providing or paying for lunches.) Twelve months of data, accurate square footages, knowledge of all electrical equipment, and lighting level measurements were only a few of the areas he covered. Attending these seminars will broaden your knowledge in these areas and increase your value as a Building Engineer to your company.
