October 7, 2018 Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 10:2-16

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Do you remember the old news show 'Crossfire' with Pat Buchanan and Michael Kinsey? I know the phrase 'old-news-show' sounds like a contradiction. You may say, "Which contradiction, there's two: the 'old-news' part or the 'news-show' part?" Do you remember long ago, when the word 'show' was never added to 'news'? It was simply 'the News'. But today everything is a 'show', which means staging, posturing and yes, 'positions'. Well, that siding or slanting is not so new either, because today's gospel drops Jesus right into the middle between polar sides in a biblical controversy full of pain, hurt & strong feelings. The gospel writer Mark's introductory description says it all. Mark 10:2, says the Pharisees, "were testing him." The Pharisees weren't trying to protect marriage as a strong family institution. They weren't working to bring healing to hurt spouses who were suffering in unhealthy/abusive relationships. They weren't reconciling broken marriages or people. No, showing no concern for others' pains, the Pharisees were simply 'testing Jesus'. They were using vulnerable people and the divinely-created institution of marriage to score popularity points and make themselves look good in a public show.

Often we hear about the good ole days of clear-cut and strict Old Testament teaching or the ancient values of good 'old-time religion', something surprising reveals itself in this debate over divorce. The Old Testament Moses turns out to be liberal and sexist in advancing a 'convenience claim divorce' to allow husbands (& only the men) to dismiss their wives. And, Moses blessed it (Deuteronomy 24:1-4)! Yet, Jesus knows the Pharisees are trapping him in a legal and loveless debate. They do not care about who is hurt in the 'so true', yet saddening reality of fractured marriages. The Pharisees are only interested in keeping their jobs as popular teachers, telling the powerful what they want to hear to justify themselves. Amazingly here, Moses turns out to be liberal and licentious in applying exception clauses to allow men to abandon their wives and marriages, according to their desires. Yet, Jesus navigates this dilemma with the expected compassion and understanding we know comes from a Good Shepherd. Jesus says, 'Take a breath and a tissue and let's all grieve that we have ended up where we thought we would never be." Then he says let's go back to the beginning. (Like the Coldplay song lyrics from 'Mad Scientist' where Chris Martin sings, 'it is such a shame for us to part, nobody ever said it would be this hard, oh take me back to the start..'). Jesus is a compassionate realist. Marriages falter and some fail. What marriage is perfect? He knows the existential brokenness of human beings. But 'broken' is not where Jesus wants us to stay. So he says, 'Let's look at what God created; what did God intend for man & woman in the beginning?" Life-giving lifetime partnerships. Jesus quotes from the first lines of the bible (Genesis) where God created man and woman for each other and for their fruitful fulfillment in marriage. The fruit and fulfillment amounted to their loving union generating natural, new life through children and family. So he mentions spouses 'leaving mother and father (their first family) to create new family bearing children in the marriage covenant. Jesus quotes Gen 2:24 about leaving mother and father, in order to establish marriage as an institution placed on the same level as the great fourth commandment honoring mother and father. Jesus invokes the 4th commandment which is the first one to direct human to human interactions, so He can emphasize that honoring marriage is on same level as honoring mother and father; the highest human honor after honoring God Himself. That is how high the stakes are with protecting and revering marriage!

So it is no surprise where Jesus takes this conversation. Immediately after his teaching with the words of Genesis, Jesus illustrates the point by placing a child in the center of the group. His own hard-headed disciples had been chasing children away, and Jesus stops them. He lifts up a child and embraces him/her, and tells the disciples that the kingdom of God belongs to them. So with any discussion about marriage, we have to keep children in the center. Are children nurtured, embraced and provided the strong, stable and loving environment needed to develop fully? Following Jesus means protecting marriage and family, supporting the faith and the full development of children within the family of God. Honoring, respecting and protecting children also honors marriage, family and God's own law!

October Month of The Holy Rosary


