





This is an excerpt from the Shippensburg Chronicle, July 14, 1950.

"New Priest is Appointed to Local Parish."

The Most Reverend George L. Leech, Bishop of Harrisburg, has announced the appointment of the Rev. Edward J. Gerrity, from assistant pastor of St. Michael Archangel Church, Sunbury, to administrator of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church on East Burd St. effective Friday, July 14.......The Rev. Mr. Gerrity was born in Centralia. He made his studies for the holy priesthood at St. Charles' College, Catonsville, Md., and St. Charles' Seminary, Overbook. He was ordained at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Harrisburg, on Dec 23, 1944 (during World War II), by Bishop Leech."
