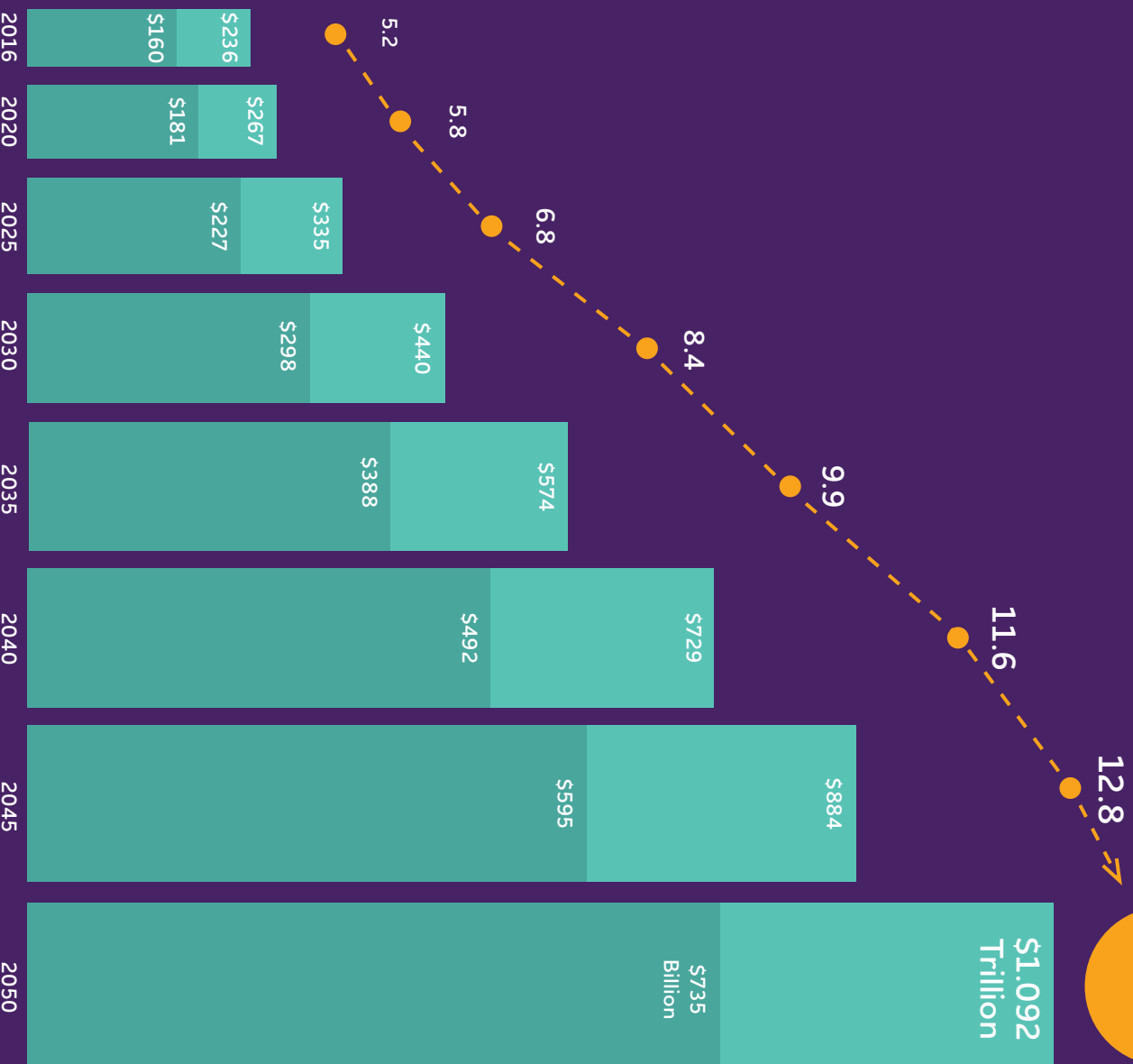

RESEARCH

An additional \$400 million in Alzheimer's research at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) would:

- Continue to fund the steps needed to meet the goal of preventing and effectively treating Alzheimer's by 2025.
- Fully fund the NIH Alzheimer's Bypass Budget proposal.

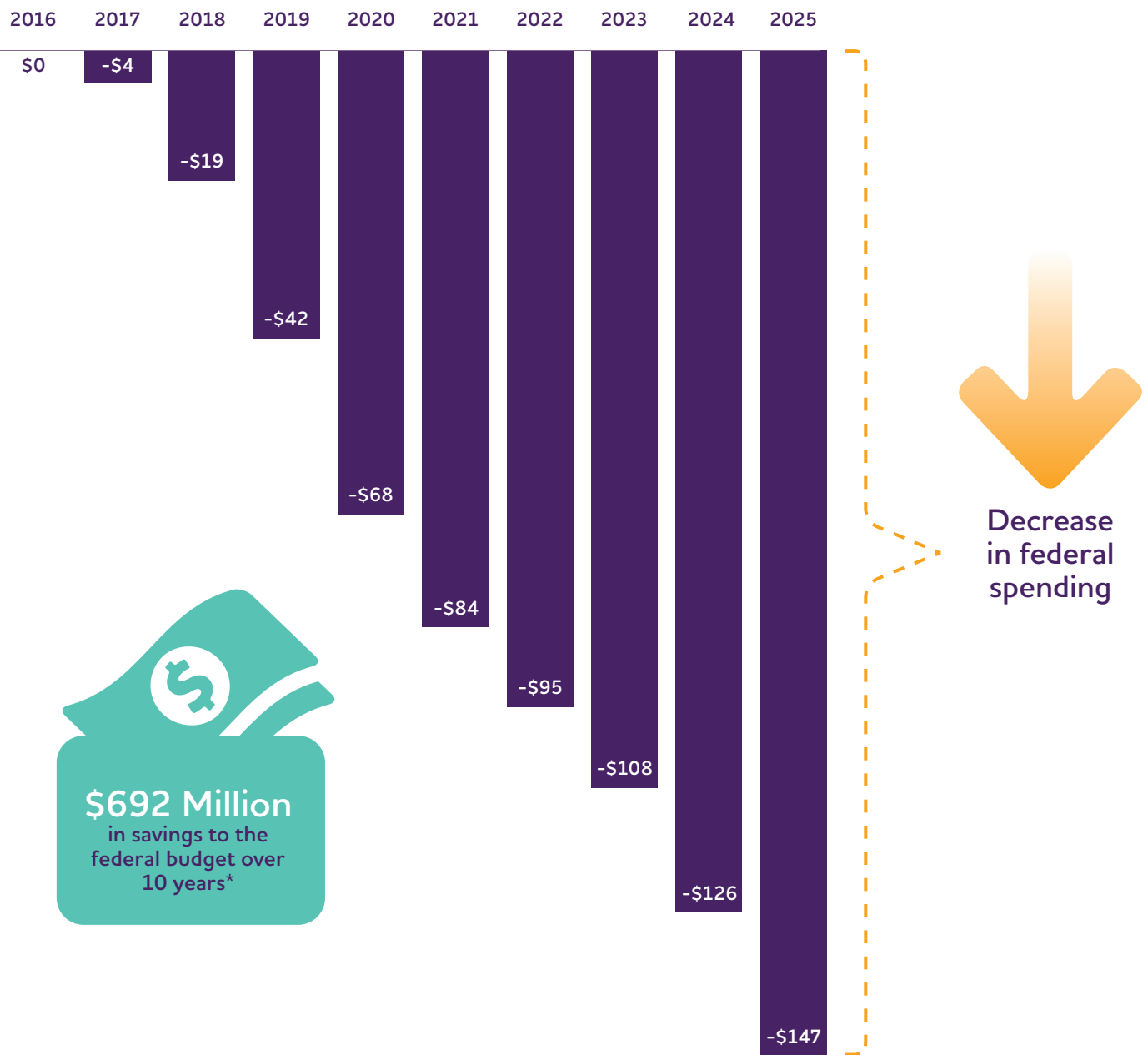

CARE PLANNING

The HOPE for Alzheimer's Act (S. 857/H.R. 1559) would:

- Provide Medicare coverage for comprehensive care planning services – for both the individual and caregiver – following a dementia diagnosis.
- Ensure a dementia diagnosis and care planning are documented in the medical record.
- Educate providers about the new benefit.

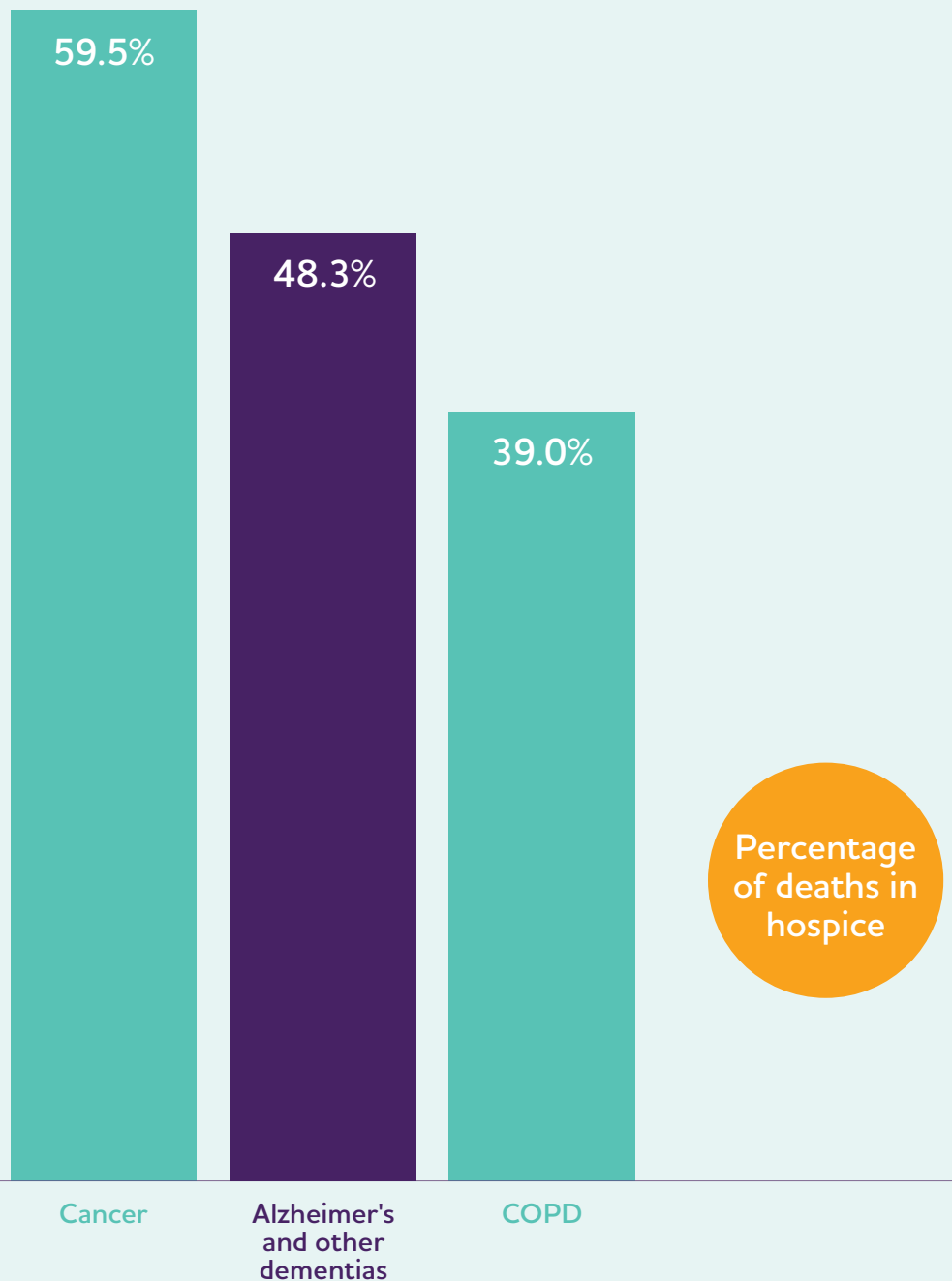

PALLIATIVE AND HOSPICE CARE

The Palliative Care & Hospice Education and Training Act (PCHETA) would:

- Establish palliative care and hospice workforce training programs for doctors, nurses and other health professionals.
- Create a national education and awareness campaign to inform patients, families and health professionals about the benefits of palliative care and available services and supports.
- Enhance research on improving the delivery of palliative care.
