MCCPTA Awards

MCCPTA Membership Awards, 2017-2018

MCCPTA recognizes local PTA/PTSAs that are building and sustaining membership with three categories of awards. Award winners will be announced at our Presidents and Principals Dinner in May; winners also will receive certificates. Membership totals for PTA fiscal year 2016-2017 will be based on MCCPTA records as of March 31, 2018; totals for the previous year also are based on MCCPTA records.

NOTE: Should there be a discrepancy between Maryland PTA and MCCPTA membership numbers for the current year, PTA/PTSAs eligible for MCCPTA awards will be notified and asked to remit any dues owed to MCCPTA by April 15, 2018. Failure to remit payment to MCCPTA may result in disqualification.

GROW IT! These awards will recognize PTA/PTSAs for their year-on-year growth in percentage terms.

- Bronze: Membership growth up to 5%
- Silver: Membership growth between 5% and up to 24%
- Gold: Membership growth between 25% and up to 49%
- Platinum: Membership growth between 50% and up to 99%
- Diamond: Membership growth 100% and over

BUILD AND SUSTAIN IT! These awards will be given to the three PTAs and/or PTSAs from each school category—elementary, middle, and high school—that have grown by 100 members or more.

ENGAGE IT! These awards will be given to the top three PTAs and/or PTSAs from each school category—elementary, middle, and high school—that have the greatest PTA member to student ratio. That ratio serves as a proxy for community involvement.
