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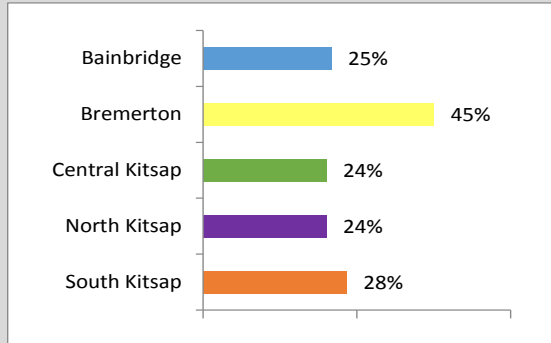

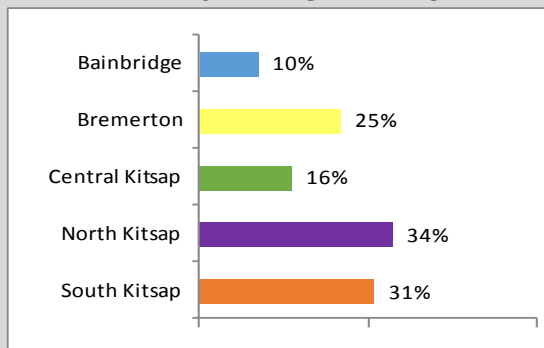

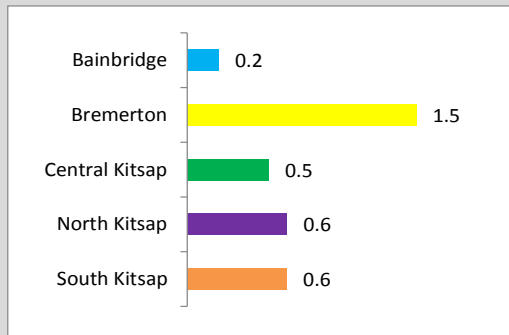

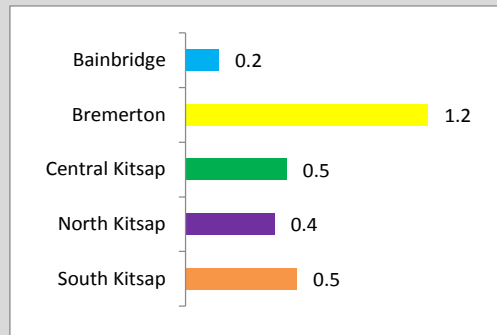

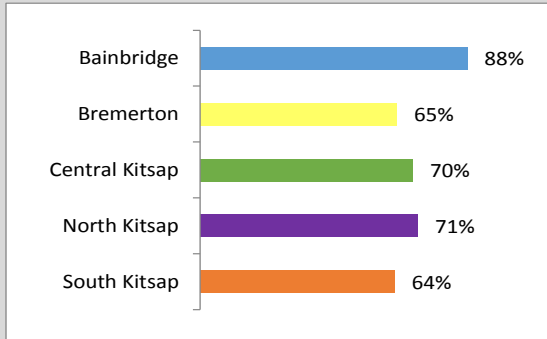

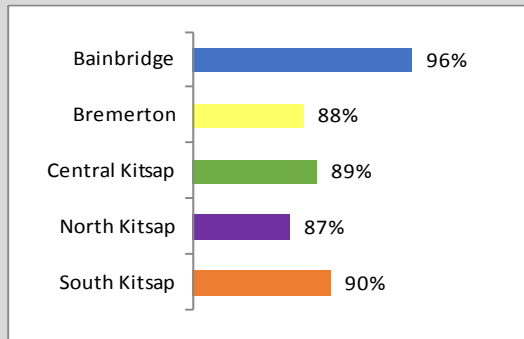

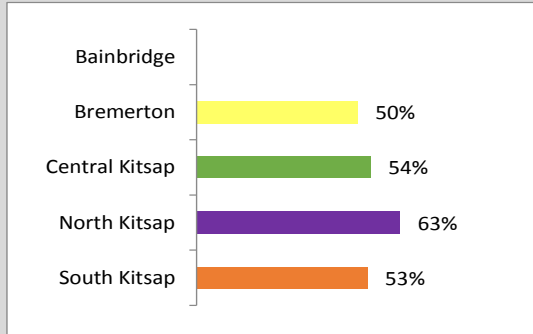

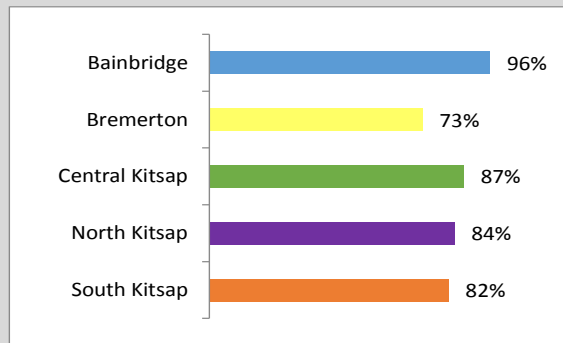

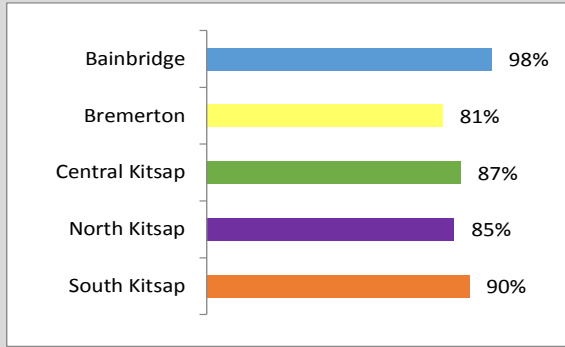

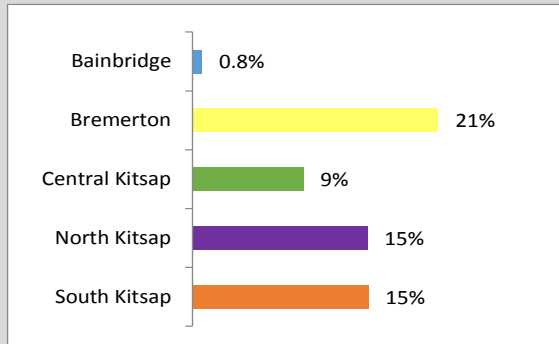

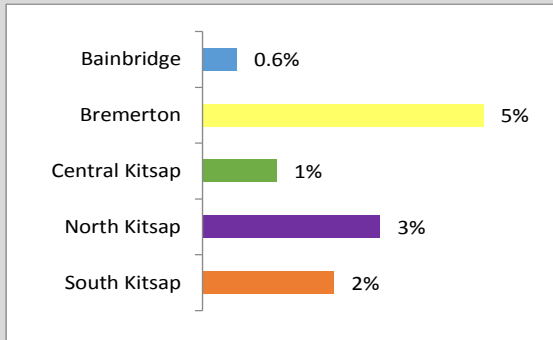

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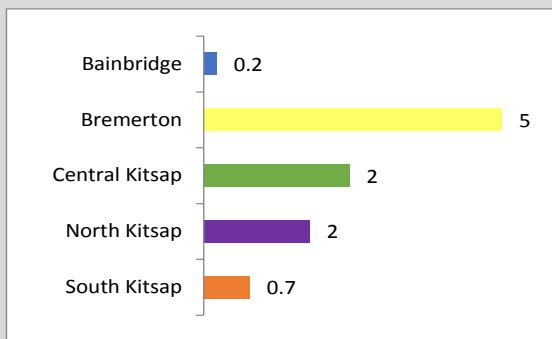

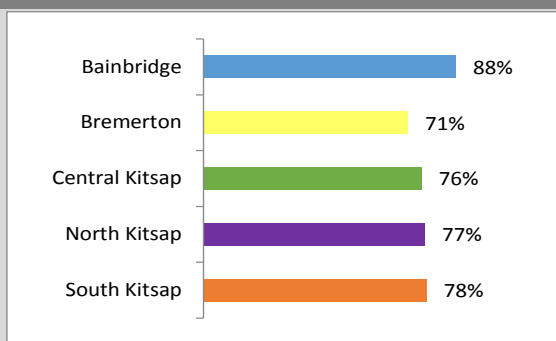

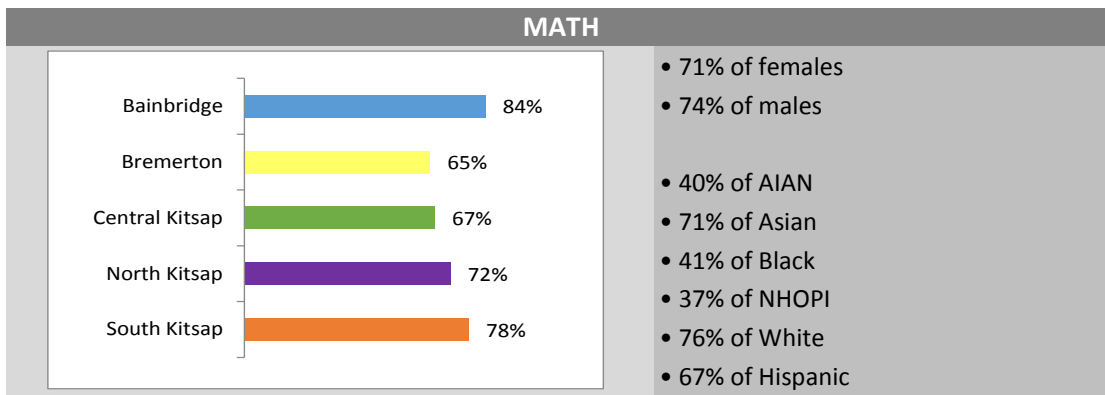

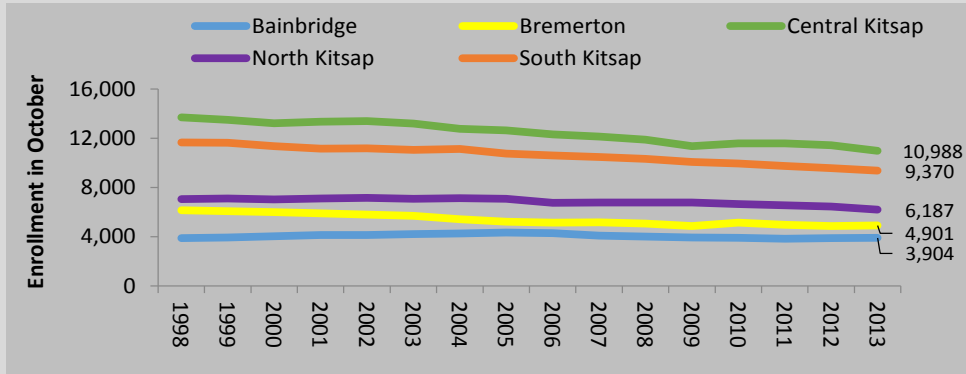

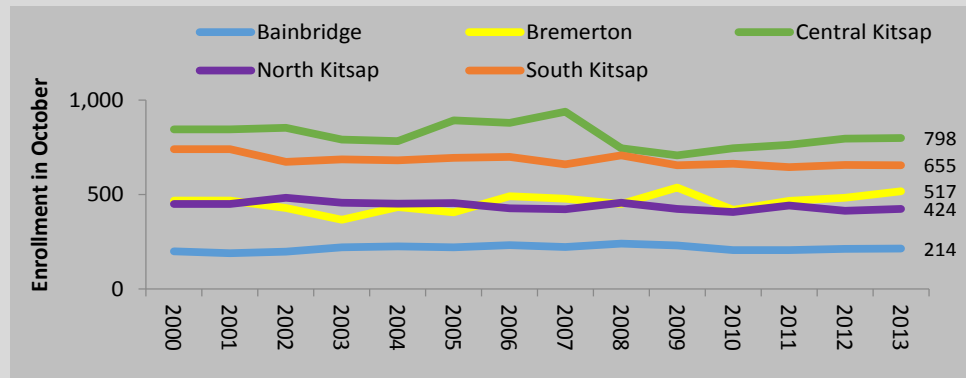

KITSAP BY SUBGROUP: Kindergarten Enrollment



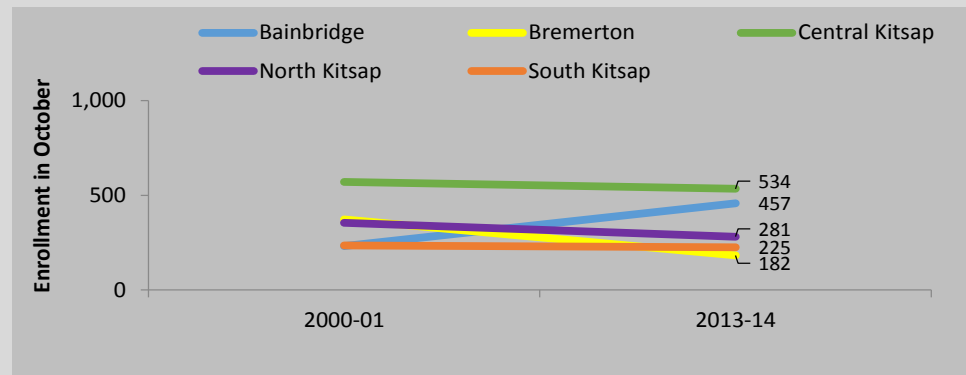

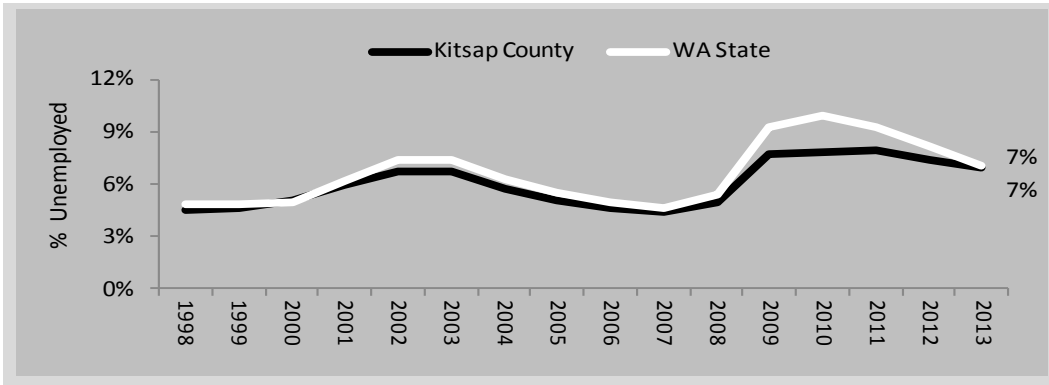

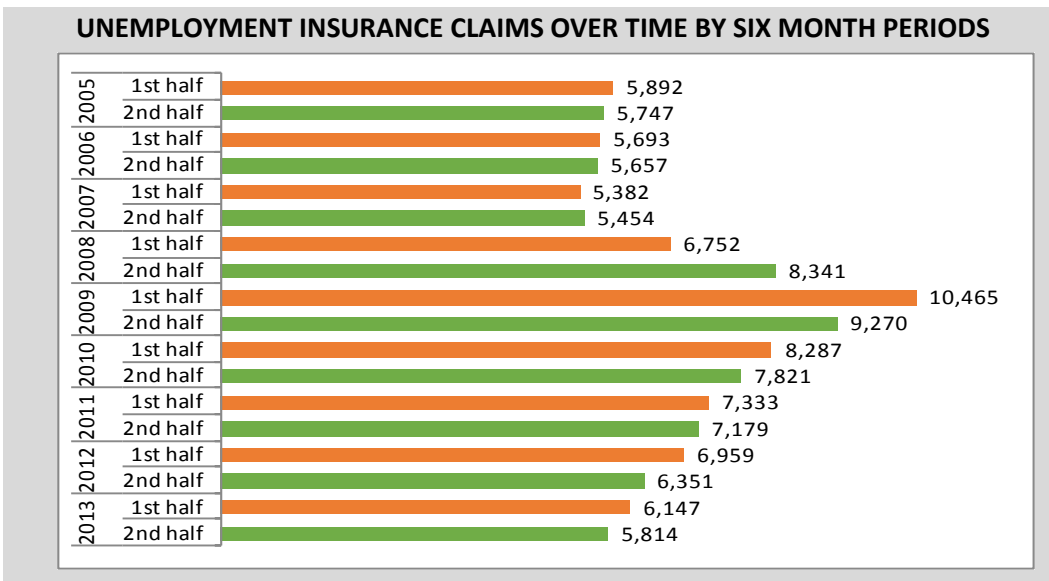

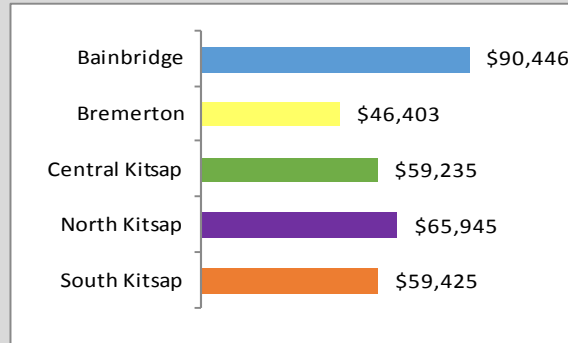

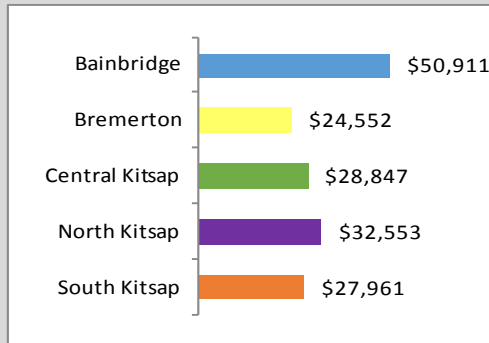

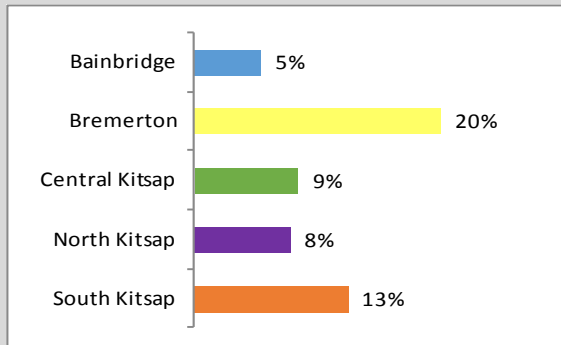

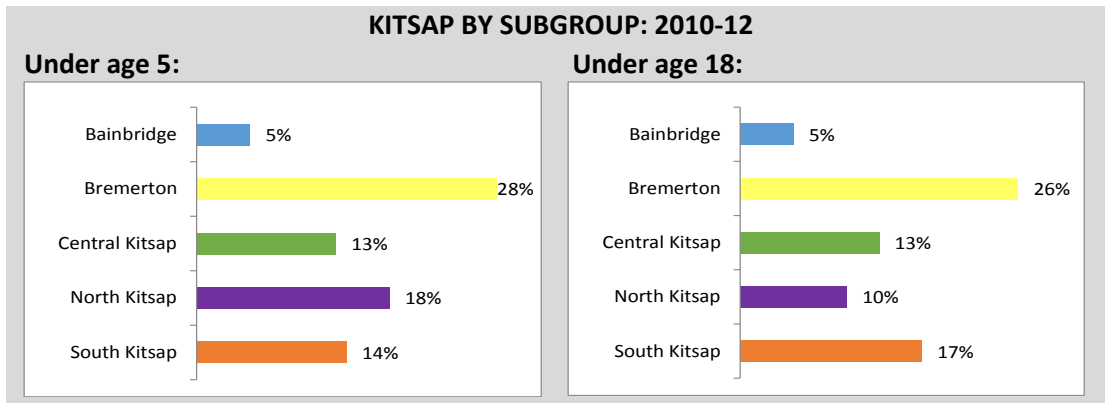

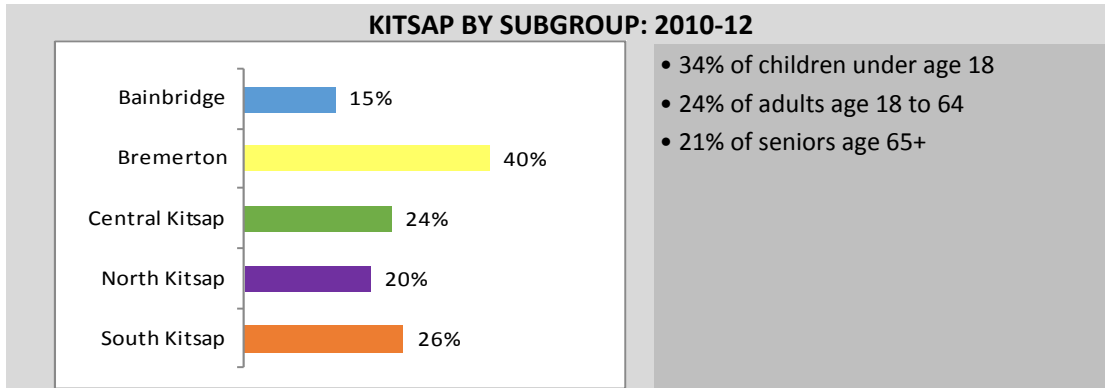

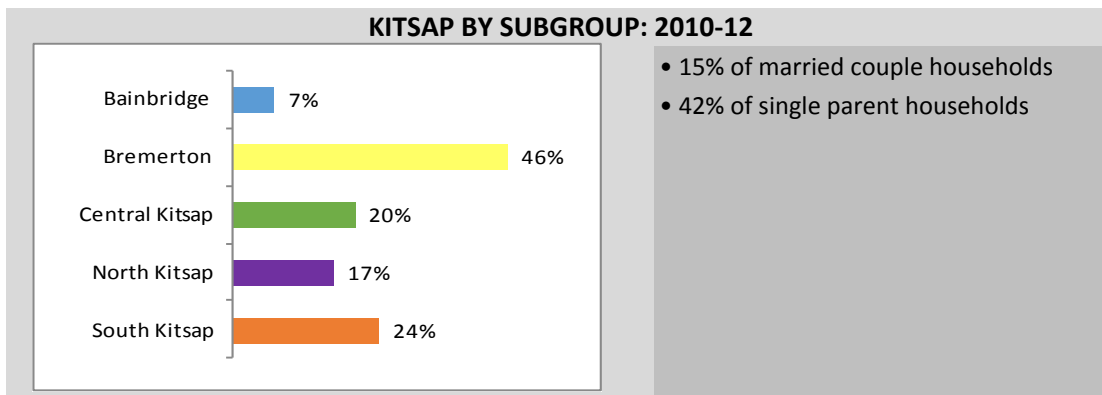

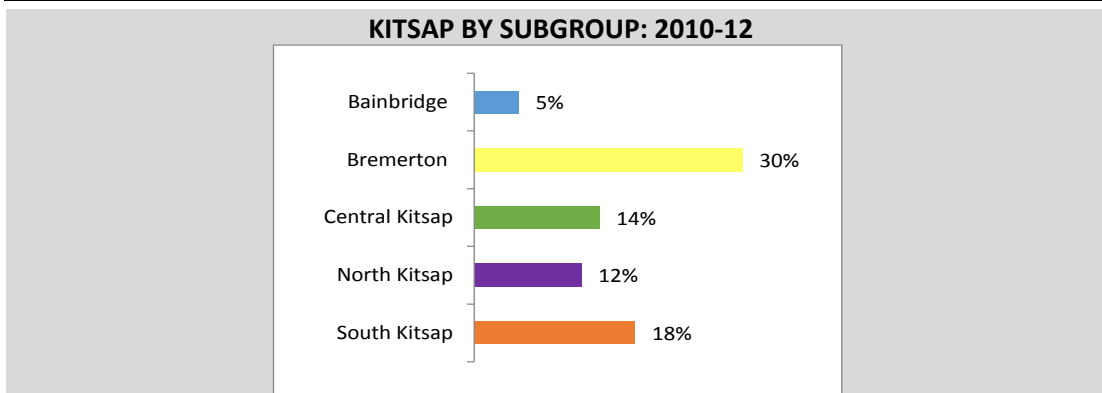


B.4.8. PERCENT OF POPULATION RECEIVING SNAP BENEFITS

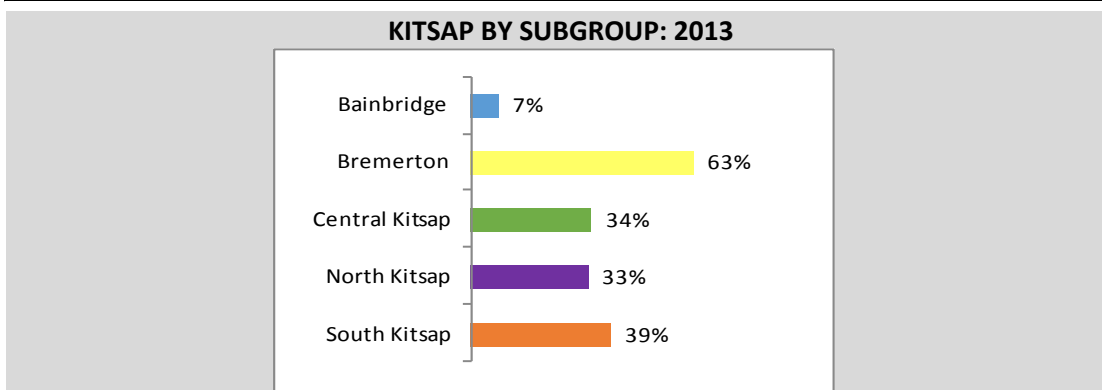

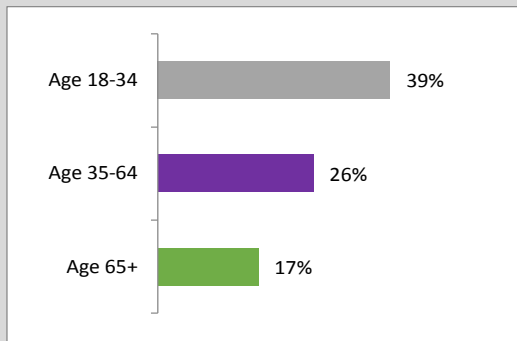

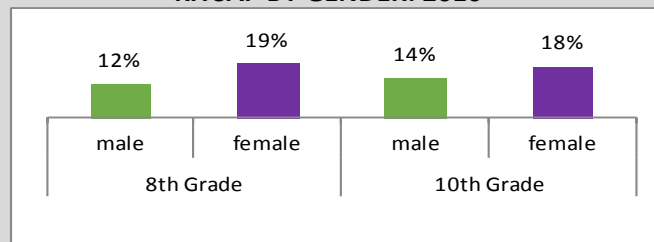

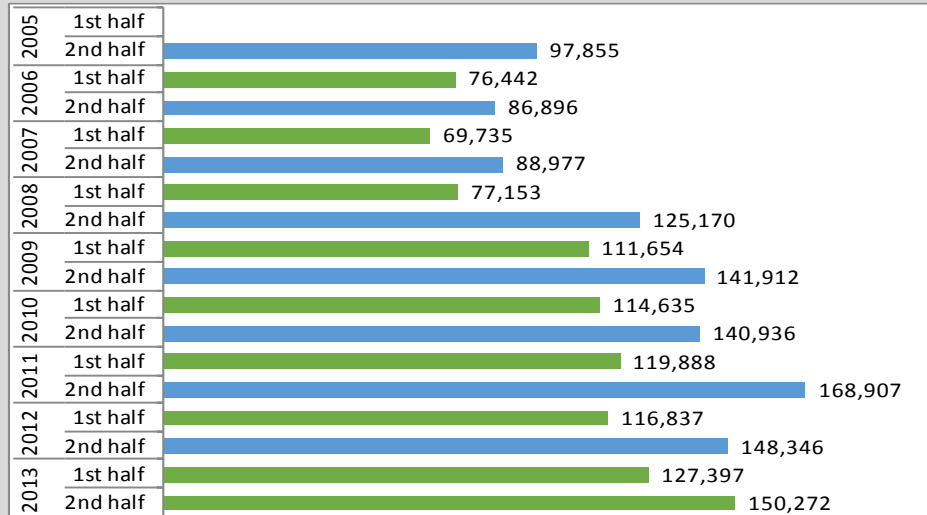

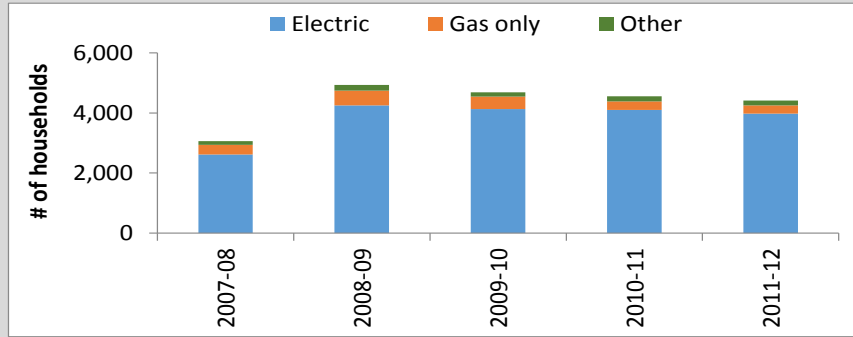

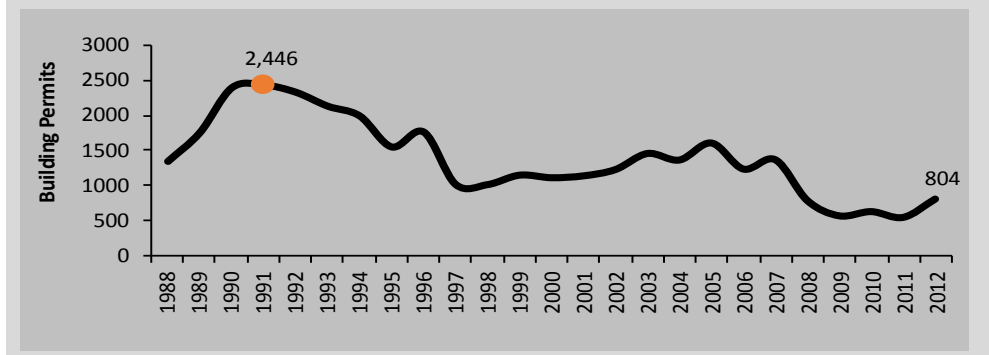
ENERGY ASSISTANCE BY TYPE

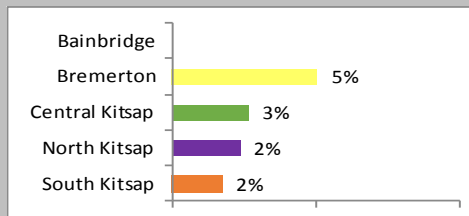

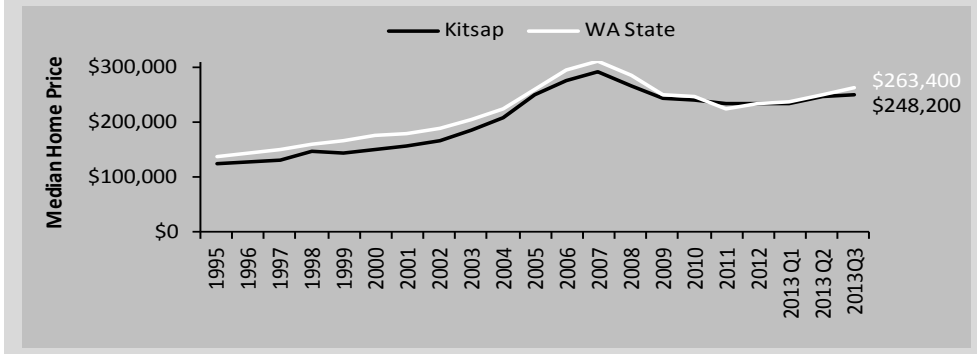

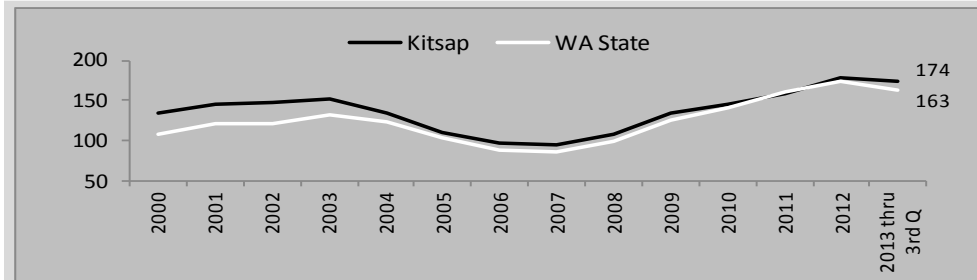

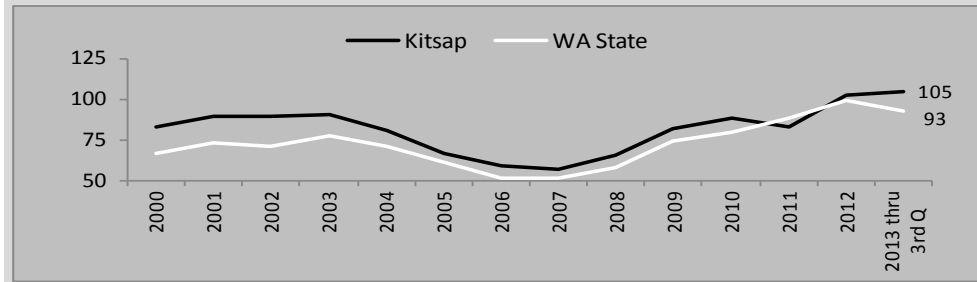
B.5.6. HOUSING AFFORDABILITY INDEX

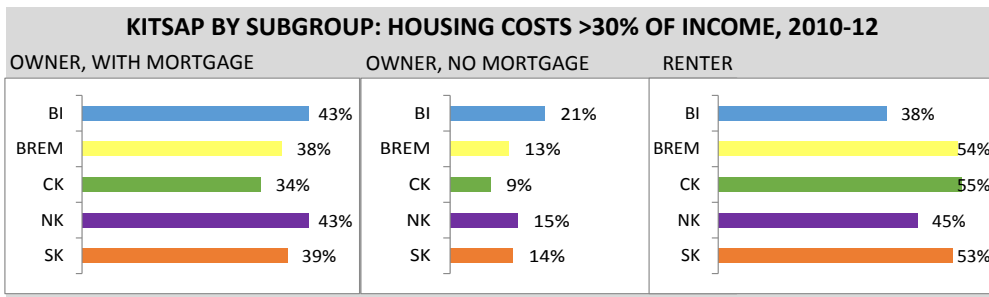
B.5.7. HOUSEHOLD SPENDING MORE THAN 30% OF INCOME ON HOUSING

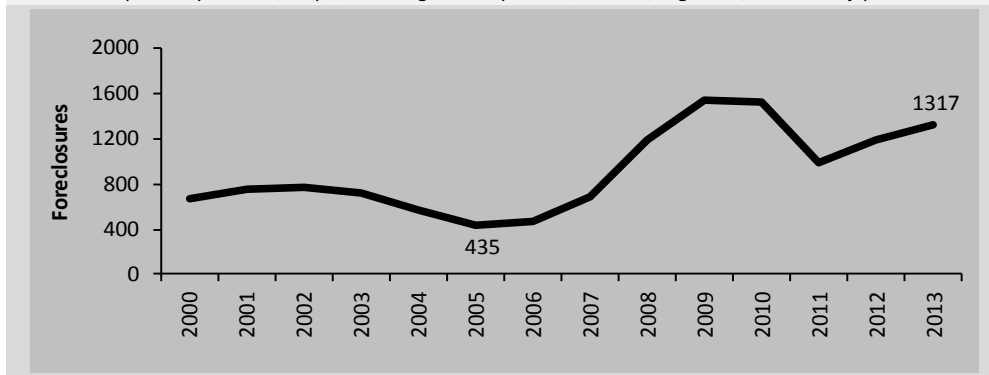

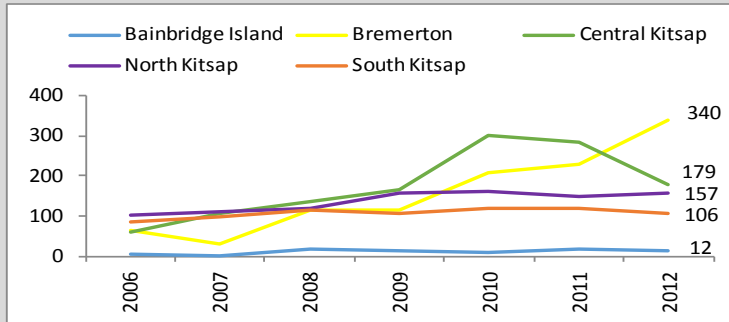

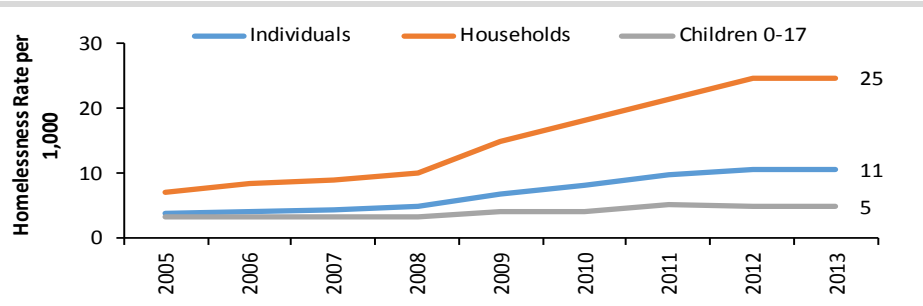

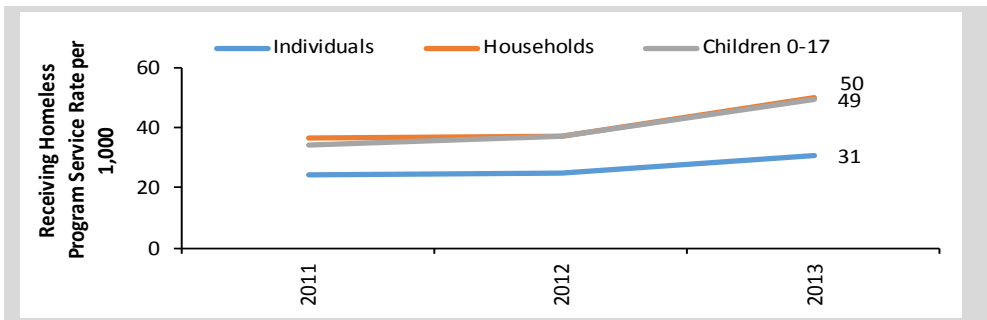

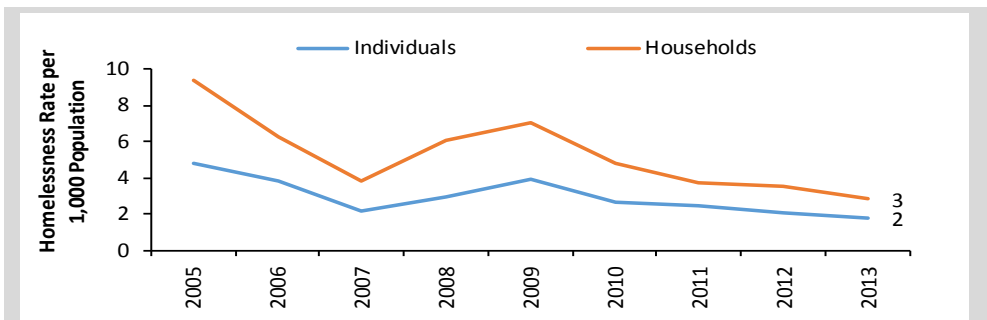
