If you asked her about her art, Carol Bridwell would tell you she is a weaver first and an artist in other mediums as she can fit them in. Carol took an early interest in fiber, learning to crochet at the age of 6. "I was fascinated watching my grandmother make intricate patterns out of string and had to know how to do that myself." This small beginning lead to her interest in weaving.

In 1986, Carol received her first loom. Self-taught, there was focus on color and patterns. She has studied many methods ad techniques to develop her style. Her passion is for creating beautiful and useful pieces with string and scraps. The fabrics she uses are industrial salvage coming in random colors and prints. Carol enjoys experimenting with the science of the craft playing colors of warp off the colors of weft, and balancing the pattern in between. The magic that comes from creating vastly different looking works coming from the same basic warp up, is addictive. You can see this at her showing at Vin Ami this month.

In 2016, Carol, with Alicia Snider, formed Phoenix Rising, which gives her the opportunity to share her work with the public - primarily, at festivals and shows in Southeastern Ohio.

In addition to fiber arts, Carol branched into woodworking. Once again using salvaged woods from barns or pallets, and other scrap materials - she has created furniture, and a wide variety of wood décor - the most popular - cutout silhouettes of a lengthy list of animals. What started with one cutout of a pig has grown to a third of the business. No animal is added until Carol feels she has captured the essence of the animal.
